PROLONGED RAIN
IS HOPE OF EVERY
LUMBERMAN

Conditions on St. John River Show No
Improvement---Today's Rain Raises
Hopes---If General For Some Days
Will Make Change

The rain which began today is the hope of all lumber operators in central New Brunswick and the Upper St. John River. The weather probabilities forecast showers but what all interested in the lumbering business want is heavy rain for several days. Conditions on the St. John River and on its tributaries where logs are hung up are unchanged according to advices received. A rise of water will mean the saving of thousands of dollars to the people of the province.

Prices of logs this spring have reached points never before heard of in the history of lumbering on the St. John River. Bank-logs at Springhill reached the record price of \$16 for merchantable and \$12 for batten. At St. John spruce pulp-logs have been bringing \$8 to \$9, pine logs \$10 and fir logs \$8.50. The St. John lumber market has never before recorded such prices.

The corporation drive which is operating from Grand Falls south is understood to be making fair progress. The water has been falling, however and trouble with this drive is anticipated unless the rains come and bring the level of the water up. Very little lumber is yet in the booms of the St. John River Log Driving Company.

BAIL REFUSED
BY JUDGE BARRY IN
JOEL SCOTT CASE

Seriousness of Offense Prevents Grant-
ing of Bail---Appeal Dismissed In
Odell Property Arbitration
Matter

In reply to the application for bail for Joel S. Scott made before him some days ago by Mr. P. A. Guthrie, counsel for the accused, Judge Barry yesterday refused to admit the prisoner to bail. The refusal of His Honor was made on the ground of the seriousness of the offense with which Scott is charged that of having carnal knowledge of a girl less than fourteen years of age. Affidavits and photographs presented when the application was made were taken as being part of the defence and were not considered in connection with the application for bail.
