

THE PANAMA-CALIFORNIA EXPOSITION

San Diego, Cal., April 17—No exposition scheme ever devised has attracted so much attention everywhere as that employed in the development of the Panama-California Exposition here in 1913. The idea is that of Col. D. C. Collier, president of the exposition, who, when the celebration was suggested, declared: "We shall eliminate products. We will show the world how the world is doing things. We will show them the wheels going around."

The San Diego Exposition is to be one in which, truly, the visitor will see the wheels going around. It is this essential difference between the San Diego Exposition and all others that has won recognition for it wherever its advantages as a community-up-building enterprise were presented.

The visitor to the accepted sort of exposition, the traditional kind of exposition—sees piles of farm produce on shelves; a whole storehouse of things pickled in buckets, preserved in tins, or just plain "canned." At San Diego nobody will see these things, for they will not be there to see. There will be actual demonstrations of how the things are pickled, how they are canned. After the demonstration of the how of doing things the product will disappear.

There will be no warehouse of farm products at San Diego. Instead there will be demonstration farms. These will show not only the farming methods employed in different localities today, such as are employed by the farmer in Georgia, the farmer in Kansas, the farmer in Washington, the farmer in Canada, or in Porto Rico, Santo Domingo, Brazil, or some of the other nations to the south that will have exhibits here, but also the farming methods used a thousand years ago, through the ages and stages of development to the present.

Of the 615 acres embraced in the exposition grounds at San Diego only 225 will be covered by buildings. The remaining ground will be devoted to outdoor displays. A whole tribe of natives of Terra del Fuego, of a race now almost vanished, numbering altogether about ninety persons, will be transplanted bodily, with all their home customs and processes to the exposition grounds. A family will live on an acre of ground, under irrigation, just to show how an acre may be made to support a family.

In the realm of transportation, science, archeology, art, domestic life, industrial life, commerce, throughout the gamut of human activities, this rule will apply. Every human activity possible of demonstration in processes will be so demonstrated. Irrigation exhibits will have prominent place, showing the visitor just how irrigation is applied to arid lands, making them blossom as the rose. All the old processes, and all the new processes, will be shown in operation. The difference between the San Diego Exposition and others has been likened to two store windows. In one is a rich display of silks. In the other a poor display of second hand implements, among which a tiny train whizzes over the rails. The second window, because of its "life," holds vastly more interest than its neighbor. The San Diego Exposition will be one of "life-action."


NOT AS BLACK AS PAINTED.


