"Let it be admitted that the policy of a Canadian navy would be more expensive than an occasional contribution of battleships to a British feet, and what has been proven? It would be cheaper to pay for five or six British regiments to garrison Canada and to provide a nucleus for a defence army than to maintain our present regular force of 5,000 or 6,000 men-much cheaper. Would the post master general favor the hiring of British troops for service in Canada?

"No quotation of cost figures enters into this question. What Can ada does for the defence of herself and of the empire must be done in the best way, regardless of cost. If a Canadian navy costs five times much as a contribution to the Brit ish fleet, I would still be in favor of it for other reasons.
