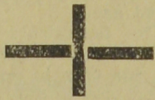

F. A. Wainwright, Captains G. A. Murray, W. J. Osborne, A. Stirling, P. A. Guthrie, James Pringle, F. A. Good, J. P. McPeake and H. F. G. Woodbridge, Lieutenants H. H. Vanwart, E. W. Sansom, A. C. Kelly, C. W. Clark and Clarkson.

Minutes of meeting held July 3rd, 1912, were read and confirmed.

Major Grey reported for committee appointed to secure a Collar Badge for the regiment. A design has been selected and approved by the commanding officer and arrangements had been made for the manufacture of the same by J. R. Gaunt & Son. On motion the report was adopted and Major Grey authorized to order the required number.

Moved by Captain Guthrie, seconded by Major Wainwright, that all officers of the regiment provide themselves with a lightweight khaki uniform for the next camp and that each officer deposit with the treasurer the price of same within one month from date. Carried. Officers named as a committee to look after the matter, Major Grey and Captain McPeake.

Moved by Captain Stirling, seconded by Major Wainwright, that the officers here assembled express to Lt.-Col. McLeod their appreciation of the fact that he had been again restored to health and would soon be able to take up the duties of his office and accompany the regiment into camp at its next annual training. Carried unanimously.

In reply, Col. McLeod expressed in strong terms his great appreciation of the motion.

The Boston trip was again discussed with the result that on motion by Captain Stirling, seconded by Captain Good, the trip was deferred indefinitely.

INVITATION EXTENDED.

On motion Captain Guthrie, seconded by Captain Woodbridge, the adjutant was instructed to communicate with the Army & Navy Veterans' Association of Boston, expressing regret that they would be obliged to postpone their visit to Boston indefinitely.

Moved by Captain Woodbridge, seconded by Captain Stirling, that an invitation be extended to the officers and past commanders of the Army & Navy Veterans' Association of Boston, to visit the regiment during camp at Sussex this year. Carried.

Moved by Captain Stirling, seconded by Captain Guthrie, that the motion to the effect that each officer contribute one day's pay to the Band Fund be enforced. Carried.

The chairman of the Band Committee reported that it was necessary that the band have a new drum and other instruments amounting to about \$100. On motion by Captain Pringle, seconded by Captain Stirling the chairman was authorized to procure these.

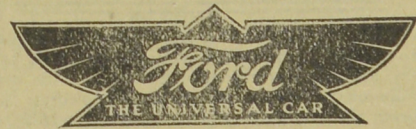
