

EDWARD B. McLEAN BUYS THREE HORSES FOR FIFTY THOUSAND

Price is Highest on Record---Horses
Now are Wintering in Florida---
To be Exhibited

New York, March 20—For \$50,000, Joseph W. Harriman, president of the Harriman National Bank, has sold to Edward B. McLean of Washington, the three high-stepping harness horses, Nala, Lady Dilham and Elegant Dilham, winners of scores of blue ribbons, championship prizes and challenge cups at the leading American horse shows. Nala is a trotting bred stallion that was once a country stud horse in Missouri.

Lady Dilham and Elegant Dilham are hackneys and are sister and brother, both being by Dilham Prime Minister out of Elegance III, by Lord Denby II. They were bred by E. D. Jordan of Boston. Lady Dilham is almost universally regarded as the best harness mare of her size and type ever bred in America or seen here. She is barely 14.2 hands high. She has twice won the championship at the National Horse Show though forced to compete with horses almost a full hand higher.

The price paid for the trio of high-steppers is the highest on record and affords a striking illustration of the fact that horses of the highest class were never so valuable and so much sought after as now.

Nala, Lady Dilham and Elegant Dilham are now in Florida in charge of "Jack" Donnelly, who has trained them while owned by Mr. Harriman. They are to be shipped to Washington at once and probably will be exhibited at the National Capital Horse Show there in May.

MICHIGAN STATES FAIR STAKES LIMITED BY CONDITIONS

Decision of Grand Circuit Members
Does Not Affect This---Stakes
Aggregate Ten Thousand

Detroit, March 20—Although the Grand Circuit has rescinded the rule limiting the amount of money stake trotters can win, the Michigan State Fair again has a condition of that sort in its program of early closing events for the meeting here September 15-20.

This is in the Michigan Stake of \$10,000 for 2:15 trotters and the condition is that any horse winning events of a face value of \$35,000 before September 2 shall not be eligible and payments shall be refunded. Other state fair races to which entries close on April 15, are the 2:12 pace, \$5,000; 2:05 pace, \$2,000; 2:16 pace, \$2,000.

SAM CRAWFORD SIGNS

Detroit, Mich., March 20—It was officially announced here today that Sam Crawford veteran right-fielder of the Detroit American League Baseball Club, has signed his 1913 contract. Pres. Navin said the contracts calls for a \$5000 salary, which is the same as the 1912 agreement.


