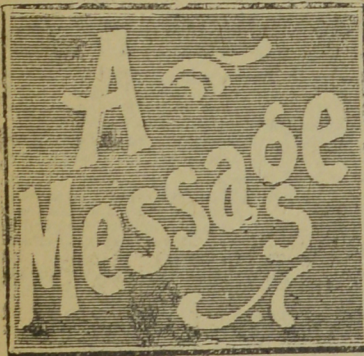

sides. Mr. Gibson's body, he said, was not deceased, his blood was not deceased. He had led an active and busy life and although blessed with a good constitution, a strong will and a noble heart, he had after ninety-four years faded from this life into eternity. Dr. Campbell said he believed as heaven and earth were drawing closer together, that we would recognize each other in the great beyond. If heaven, with its pearly gates and golden streets and angels singing, was without friends, we then would wish ourselves back to earth and friendship but in the glorious haven of rest we would enjoy friendships, music and all that would make heaven a place of joy forever.

The service closed with the hymn "Rock of Ages," and the large funeral procession formed and wended its way along the Nashwaak to the Methodist cemetery.

With the flag at half-mast on the Post Office and the Cotton Mill, with the mill's big bell pealing out in toll for its honored dead, the last mortal remains of the town's founder, the late Alexander Gibson, was being carefully carried to their last resting place in the Methodist cemetery on the western side of the beautiful Nashwaak, beside those of his wife, who had predeceased him by some fifteen years. The service at the house, the long procession of sad and sorrowful mourners, representing all branches of work and classes and creeds of men, the scene at the grave with the impressive service was indeed a touching tribute to the winding up of a long, noble and honored life, which sent a thrill of sadness to the hearts of all who witnessed the close of an active, progressive and well advanced career.

STEAM SHOVEL AT WORK.

The steam shovel and a large crew of men has resumed operations on the Marysville spur of the Fredericton & Grand Lake Railway this morning. It is likely that the line will be completed as it is desired to get it finished in order to get coal to the Marysville Cotton Mill. The steel can be laid on the spur in a few days. CARDINAL RAMPOLLA'S 70th BIRTHDAY

Rome, Aug. 16—Cardinal Rampolla, who, of all the members of the Sacred College, is probably the closest friend and warmest supporter of Cardinal Gibbons, Archbishop Ireland and other leaders of the liberal element of the Roman Catholic Church in America, is receiving congratulations in anticipation of his seventieth birthday, which comes tomorrow.

For many years Cardinal Rampolla has wielded immense influence in Vatican circles, though this influence is not now so great as formerly, owing to the ascendancy of the reactionaries. He was the papal secretary of state under Leo XIII and under that pontificate he was perhaps the most influential and powerful force in the Catholic hierarchy. But for his extreme liberality, which was offensive to the conservative members of the College of Cardinals, it is believed that he would have been selected to succeed Leo XIII in the pontificate.

Cardinal Rampolla is quite as famous for his learning as for his ability as a diplomat and statesman. He is the author of the best works extant upon the traditions of the Greek church, and upon the infallibility of the Pope, and some years ago he published a notable volume on the historical accuracy of the story of the Maccabees.

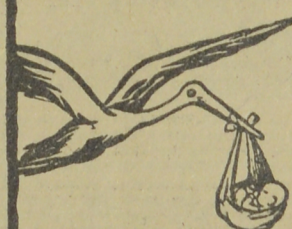
NEW YORK MOTORISTS.
