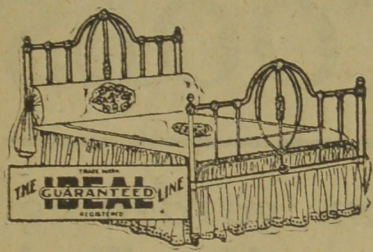

THE MOUNT ALLISON FORWARD MOVEMENT

For upwards of twenty years Mount Allison University has been going behind at an average rate of \$2000 per year. Interest has been piling up on this and there is at the present time, a debt of \$113,000 on the institutions. On ordinary operation, it is found that for every \$40 received in tuition fees, \$100 is spent. The present endowment fund of the University is not sufficient to make up the difference. Hence the deficit.

With the \$250,000 which the present campaign is expected to produce, it is the intention to erect and equip at a cost of some \$500,000 a new science building, which will enable Mount Allison to give as good a science course as is available in Eastern Canada. The remaining \$200,000 will be invested and will produce an average rate of interest of fully 6 per cent. It is considered better to invest this money than to pay off the present indebtedness, inasmuch as a considerable portion of the \$113,000 outstanding against the University, is bonded at a rate of 4 per cent. It may readily be carried for a time at least and the difference between the interest charges on it and the revenue derived from the increased endowment may be placed to the credit of the ordinary operating account.

It is the intention of the governors of the University to establish a chair of Biology and at once to increase the salaries of the professors. It is found impossible to retain the services of capable men at the rates now paid, for the highest salary in Mount Allison today is only \$1400. The University is thus at the present time, not able to compete with smaller institutions in other parts of Canada which are paying their staff very much larger salaries.

In the movement now in progress, Dr. Graham, General Secretary of Education for the Methodist Church, has been of great assistance to local committees. He will devote several weeks to this work, accompanying the leaders to the different sections where the movement is in progress. Dr. Borden and Dr. Campbell are making a tour of the provinces and will speak in Charlottetown and in Halifax in the interests of Mount Allison.

"Another feature to which we would call particular attention is the elephants ball game. These fellows are ready good, boys; give 'em a hand."

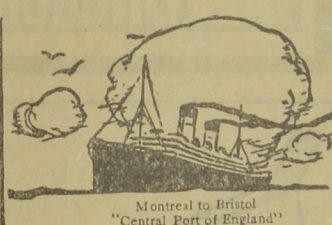

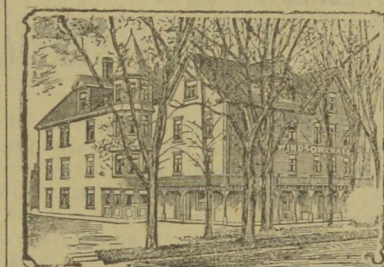

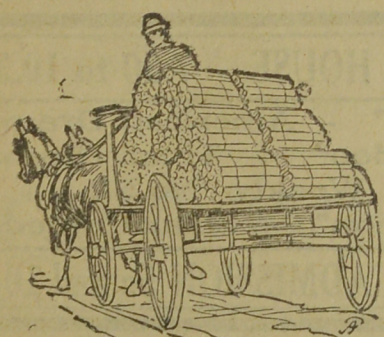
