result of years of earnest thought by leading statesmen. It has become a recognized instrument of wise administration. An opportunity is now t hand whereby we may declare our readiness to march in line with morern methods of democracy. It will mean much to the life of the city to errove the administration of justice rom civic politics. It will be the rst step in the cleansing of the city.


