John Davidson and Joseph Kehoe have been arrested on the charge of entering a school-house a short distance above Springhill on Thursday, and assaulting the inmates. Five men were concerned in this disturbance which resulted in the teacher and pupils being forced to leave the building. Detective James Roberts is working on the case and other arrests are expected. CONCESSIONS ASKED FOR.

Messrs. R. B. Hanson and Willis MacPherson appeared before the City Council in committee last night and asked for exemption from taxation for a certain term of years, free water and sewerage and a license to build in King Street for the MacPherson Foundry and Garage. The Board of Trade has written the secretary of the New Brunswick Board of Fire Underwriters to ascertain if the erection of the building would increase insurance rates on adjacent buildings. Pending a reply the application has been taken into consideration. Plans for the proposed building have been filed. It is to be of brick with metal roof and will be one story in height.

RESIGNED OFFICE.

The resignation of Dr. G. C. VanWart as appointee of the City Council on the Board of School Trustees, has been received and accepted by the Council. Dr. VanWart's resignation was made necessary through his appointment by the Provincial Government as chairman of the Board. It is understood that the City Council will appoint his successor as representative of the congregation of Christchurch Parish Church.

NEW X-RAY APPARATUS

(Continued from page 1)

TUBERCULOSIS EXAMINATION

Dr. Townsend, superintendent of the Jordan Memorial Sanatorium will be at the hospital tomorrow to receive for the first time, applicants for admission to this excellent Institution. One of the Board asked Dr. Mullin if there might not be some danger of contagion if the meetings were held in the Board room. The Dr. replied that tuberculous germs are flying all around and the danger from infection depends upon the constitution of the individual. The Secretary will confer with the Matron and provide Dr. Townsend with a suitable room for examination of applicants.

X-RAY DEMONSTRATIONS

At this stage of the meeting Dr. McGinnis, Dr. VanWart, and Mr. G. N. Babbitt arrived and through the President received a hearty welcome. Dr. McGinnis is said to be one of the brightest engineering experts in Canada today and cheerfully gave his valuable time in helping Mr. Wiggin, the manufacturer expert to install the new X-Ray plant. He answered questions as also did Dr. VanWart and Mr. Babbitt, and these three gentlemen reported the plant satisfactory and fully up to agreement. After this Dr. McGinnis assisted by "Prof." Kelley, gave demonstrations of the machine gratifyingly to the gratification of the Trustees. A heavy book with a coin in the centre was placed in front of the dowscope and the hard cash was distinctly seen. Mr. Babbitt placed himself in front of the machine and the mayor looked through his body and declared his back bone normal. Then Dr. VanWart placed his foot, encased in heavy boot, in front and every tendril of the foot was clearly seen. After numerous other demonstrations a hearty vote of thanks was extended to Dr. McGinnis and his associates for their generous aid to the Trustees by their co-operation and great kindness in assisting in the selection and installation of what is claimed to be the best X-Ray plant made today.

These gentlemen responded and placed their services at call of the hospital at any time. Everything having been reported satisfactory the Treasurer was authorized to pay the bill which will total about \$1500.00.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO FUND

Mr. Clark from the committee submitted a list of contributors to this fund which amounts to \$1075.00 and as some others have promised to assist it was decided to keep the fund open until last of March, when a complete list of the donors will be published. It is expected a couple of hundred dollars more will settle the bill. In addition to all they do for the hospital the Ladies Aid members have undertaken the construction of a dark room for development of X-Ray pictures. Any others wishing to help will early send their contributions to Mr. W. G. Clark or Mr. J. F. McMurray.

IMMEDIATE NEEDS

Dr. VanWart addressed the Trustees upon the immediate needs of the Institution. The X-Ray plant was a splendid asset of the hospital but the Trustees must not stop there. One of the most pressing needs today is an up-to-date operating room. He strongly urged that steps be taken to enlarge the hospital and keep abreast of the age. Friends will come to the rescue if the work is undertaken, and the first thing he thought they should do was to engage the services of an hospital architect and have a building erected that will contain a modern operating room and other necessary departments. To back up his request Dr. VanWart handed in his cheque for a generous sum and the Doctor is also one of the generous contributors to the X-Ray plant.

Before the Doctor retired the Trustees expressed their thanks for his assistance and valuable suggestions. Dr. Mullin and the Secretary were appointed to look into provision of some medical supplies, and after a lot of bills had passed through the hands of the Audit Committee the board adjourned.
