

NOTED INVENTOR DID MUCH FOR MANKIND

London, Jan. 18-It will be one hundred years tomorrow since there was born in a little village in Hertfordshire a man whose life, according to the opinions expressed by the newspapers at the time of his death fifteen years ago, had been more use ful to humanity than that of any other one person. The man was Sir Henry Bessemer, who will be known cess for converting cast iron into forever as the inventor of the prosteel without the use of fuel.

Bessemer did for the steel industry what Newton did for astronomy and what Darwin did for natural science. The revolution in that industry following upon the discovery of applied steam power.

Before the Bessemer process came into vogue the production of steel in Great Britain was only 50,000 tons annually, and the average price was \$250 a ton. In 1911 the production in the United Kingdom reached 5,500,000 tons. In the same year the world by the cheapening of steel is 185estimated at \$250,000,000 a year-equal to more than one-half the






