STOCK MARKET

New York, Jan. 20—Sentiment in the financial district is still dominated by political considerations. The theory has been evolved that there is bound to be a slowing up of general business in more or less degree as a result of the attitude recently shown by President-elect Wilson and while some of the larger interests are hopeful for the best they are not yet willing to back these hopes with purchases of stocks. The result is that the stock market is left largely to professional interests who find it easier to depress prices. Bears argue with some reason that if this situation persists much longer, it will only be a question of time until small speculative holders of stocks will become weary and liquidate and it is to accomplish this end that large professionals are hammering values from day to day.

BOARD OF TRADE EXECUTIVE

Transportation matters are expected to occupy a prominent place in the deliberations of the executive of the Board of Trade this evening when matters referred to that body at the annual meeting of the board will be discussed. It is probable that an effort will be made to have a member of the I. C. R. board of management visit the city to talk over the matter of excessive freight rates. Coal from the Minto mines pays very high freight rates and it is thought the matter should receive consideration. The executive will also deal with the matter of securing a permanent office for the Publicity Commissioner.

NEWS AND NOTES OF FINANCIAL WORLD

EXCHANGE SEATS STILL DECLINE

New York, Jan. 16—A seat on the New York Stock Exchange was sold today for \$51,000, the lowest price recorded since 1908. Last week a seat brought \$53,000. The low price reflects the stagnation and condition of affairs in the stock market.

WINNIPEG NOT YET SOLD

Sir William Mackenzie stated yesterday that the negotiations for the sale of the Winnipeg Electric Railway Company to the Reese Syndicate of New York had not yet been concluded. "The matter is still in abeyance," he said.

NEW BRANCH BANKS

During December, 1912, 32 branch banks were opened in Canada and 12 were closed, according to Houston's Bank Directory. Canadian banks have 2,884 branches, of which 76 are outside of Canada.

WINNIPEG ELECTRICS BIG INCREASE

Winnipeg, Jan. 17—According to the official statement of the Winnipeg Electric Ry. Co. there has been an increase of 69 per cent. in the gross earnings of the company in two years. The gross earnings for 1912 for street car business alone amounted to \$2,114,947. In 1910 the gross earnings were \$1,265,871. The increase in two years is, therefore, \$849,076. The city will this year receive as its percentage of the gross earnings the sum of \$105,748, being 5 per cent. gross earnings.

HOME RULE TO BECOME LAW IN MAY, 1914

London, Jan. 17—As anticipated, the Home Rule Bill passed its third reading in the House of Commons last night with flying colors, the majority being the handsome one of 110. Thus has the Irish parliamentary party, who since 1866 has waged the fight for its country's freedom, entered into the enjoyment of the first fruits of its labor.

There is no necessity to refer to the closing stages of the debate, beyond saying that Bonar Law's reckless appeal to Ulster not to let the fires of resistance, again showed how utterly unfitted he is for the leadership of the party. Whether he remains at the head of his party for the present or not, the country will judge him by his words when the time comes.

The second reading of the bill in the House of Lords has been fixed for Jan. 27, when the lords will probably make their unavailing protest against Home Rule becoming law. The fight has now been practically won and the bill will undoubtedly come into force under the parliament act not later than May, 1914.


