



The setting of the bread should be the temperature of the body. A grop of liquid that feels neither hot nor cold when placed in the palm of the nand will test this. The rising of the read should be at room temperature or slightly above and should be kept even. The baking temperature should be so adjusted that the ordinary loaf may be baked from fifty minutes to an hour without burning or even somewhat longer. The bread may ei-ther be put into a very hot oven, and the temperature then lowered or it may be put into a moderate oven and this same temperature continued.

It is most important that the bread should be thoroughly baked, both to avoid the pasty mess of the slack baked loaf that is decidedly indigestble and to kill any germs present.
Yeast is killed at a somewhat lower temperature, but there are usually acid producing bacteria (not disease germs) present in the dough that are quite resistant to the heat. To in sure the thorough baking the loa
