IMPROVEMENTS AT YORK STREET SCHOOL TO GO ON

Board of Health and School Board had
Joint Meeting This Morning--
Health Authorities Withdrew
Their Objections

There was a joint meeting of the Board of Health and School Board this morning at which the plumbing improvements at the York Street School were discussed. The outcome of the joint meeting was that the Board of Health has permitted the work on the improvements to continue although it does not comply with the regulations of the Provincial Board of Health. This is as a matter of convenience to the School Board. It, at the expiration of a year, the sanitary system being installed in the York Street School is found to be unsatisfactory, the Board of Health will have the power to order it removed and something more suitable installed.

The meeting this morning took place at City Hall. The members of the two committees gathered in the Mayor's office but the Assessment Appeals Committee was meeting this morning, the other meeting, at the request of the mayor was transferred to the City Council Chamber. In addition to the members of the boards, there were present F. Neil Brodie of St. John, architect for the improvements at the York Street School; A. H. Farrell, who has the contract for the improvements, and Plumbing Inspector George Edney.

The work at the York Street School was held up by the plumbing inspector some time ago on the ground that it did not comply with the provincial plumbing regulations. Mr.

THOMAS ROWAN DROPPED DEAD THIS MORNING

Well Known Lincoln Farmer Stricken at
his Home--Had Been in Poor
Health for Some Time but
Death was not Expected

Thomas Rowan, a well known farmer of Lincoln, dropped dead at his home at about eleven o'clock this morning. The deceased was watching his son, Fred Rowan, mending a mowing machine preparatory to buying when seized by the fatal attack. He gasped for breath and his son, noting that something was wrong, caught his father and supported him. Death ensued in a few minutes, the deceased not speaking again.

The late Mr. Rowan had been in poor health for some time but death was not expected in the sudden manner in which it came. The deceased was about seventy years of age and was well known in this section of the province. His wife died upwards of a year ago. Two sisters, one son and two daughters survive. The children are Fred Rowan of Lincoln, with whom the deceased made his home; Miss Margaret Rowan of the staff of the F. B. Edgecombe Co., and Mrs. Thomas McDonough of Burton. The sisters are Mrs. John Quigley and Mrs. Michael Ryan of this city. Arthur V. Rowan and Murray Rowan are nephews.

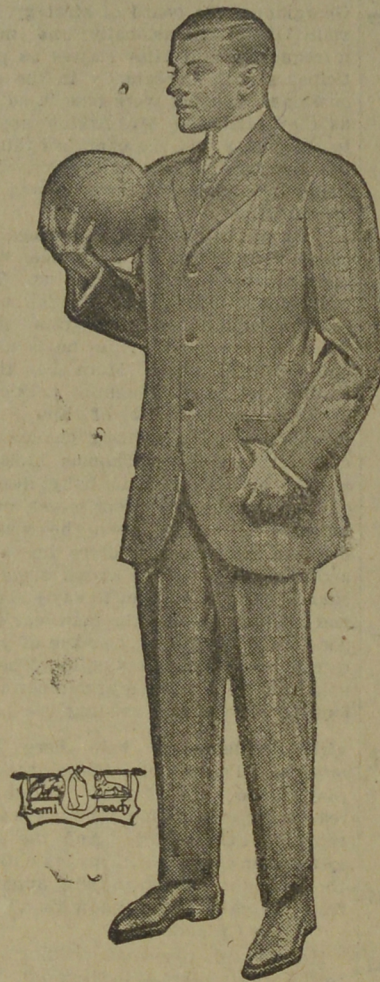
