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TODAY IN CANADIAN HISTORY

One of the most distinguished of the Canadian educators of the last century was Alexander Burns, who died in Toronto thirteen years ago today. He was born in Castletown, Ireland, in 1834, and emigrated to this country at the age of thirteen. He was graduated at Victoria College, Toronto, in 1861. For ten years, beginning in 1868, he was president of Wesleyan Ladies' College in Hamilton. Some of his religious views did not meet with the approval of his fellow Methodists and in 1882 he was the defendant in a heresy trial conducted by the Ontario Methodist Conference, but was acquitted.

Jacob Gould Schurman, president of Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y., was born in Freetown, Prince Edward Island, fifty-nine years ago today, the son of Robert and Lydia Schurman. He was educated in Canada, England, Scotland, France and Germany, at the universities of London, Edinburgh, Paris, Heidelberg, Berlin and Göttingen, and also studied in Italy. He was the winner, in 1875, of the Gilchrist scholarship for Canada at the University of London. Returning to Canada in 1880, he became professor of English literature, political economy and psychology at Acadia College, Nova Scotia. In 1882 he went to Dalhousie College, Halifax, as professor of metaphysics and English literature, remaining there four years, and in the meantime was honored with election as honorary life-governor of University College, London. Dr. Schurman left Canada twenty-seven years ago to accept the chair of Sage professor of philosophy at Cornell, and became president of that great institution in 1892. Although long an expatriate, Dr. Schurman has never lost interest in his native land and keeps in close touch with Canadian affairs, men and measures.
