Bank statement shows a reserve now \$38,812,500 increase of \$8,829,100.

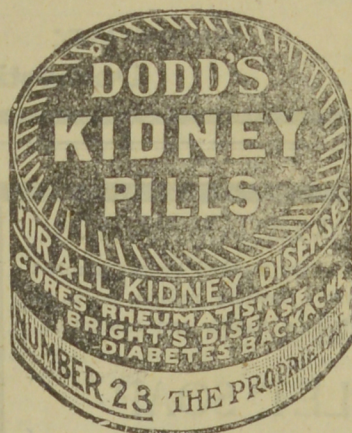
President Gray says report that Great Northern has stopped work because of rate decision is untrue.

The program arranged for the convention is unusually interesting and includes addresses by a number of noted newspaper owners and editors from various parts of the country. The most extensive preparations have been made for the entertainment of the visiting editors and for a week after the adjournment of the convention they will be kept busy sight-seeing. Tours have been arranged to the top of Pike's Peak to the Cave of the Winds, Manitou Springs, Canon City, Cripple Creek and Denver. One of the entertainment features will be a banquet at the Antlers Hotel.

FREIGHT AGENTS IN SESSION

Buffalo, N. Y., June 17—The twenty-sixth annual convention of the American Association of Local Freight Agents met in this city today for a three days' session. Three hundred members are in attendance from all the large railroad centers of the United States and Canada. The sessions will be devoted to the discussion of technical questions in connection with freight traffic, such as storage and elevator charges, standard forms and methods, and the distribution of work in freight stations. C. E. Cochran of Baltimore, is president of the association.

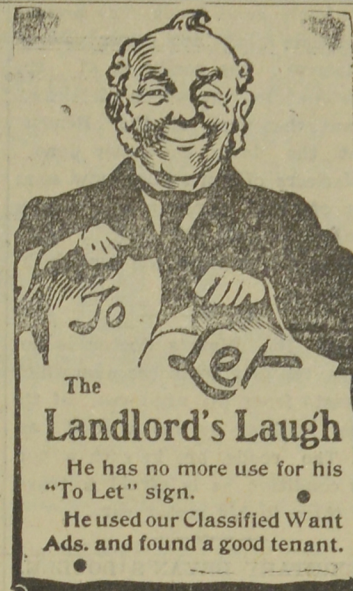
