RAILWAY SLEUTHS IN SESSION

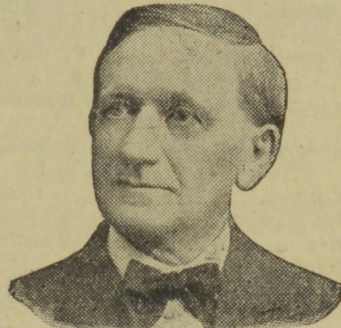
Salt Lake City, June 17—Practi-

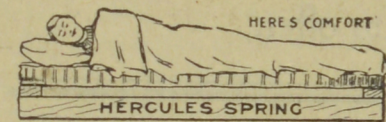
