**BELONGED TO FAMILY
OF RAILWAY MEN**

A correspondent sends the following account of the recent fatal accident on the Southamptton Railway, whereby Brakeman Percy Kennedy lost his life:

On April 22, in warping a car into a siding at Crocket, Brakeman Percy Kennedy of Millville, was caught between the rope and car and was instantly killed.

Deceased was the youngest son of Claude Kennedy of Millville, a well known C.P.R. employee. He leaves to mourn their loss a father, a mother, six brothers, Murray, Walter, Stephen and Harry of Millville, Thomas of St. Mary's and William of Woodstock, all railway men, and one sister, Mita Mina, at home, besides a large circle of relatives and friends.

Deceased was a smart and intelligent young man of twenty-two years and highly esteemed by all who knew him.

Many floral tributes were sent from all directions.

The funeral took place on the afternoon of the 24th at his home and was largely attended.

The services were conducted by Rev. I. E. Vanwart, assisted by Rev. Quigg and Rev. Lester.

Pall-bearers were brothers of the deceased.
