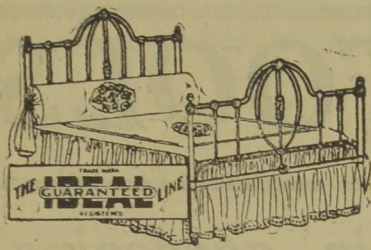

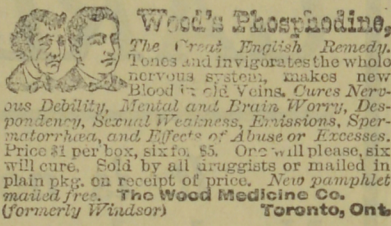

### PEACE CONGRESS TO MEET AT ST. LOUIS

St. Louis, Mo., April 28—Advises received by the committee in charge of local arrangements indicate that the fourth American Peace Congress, which is to hold forth in St. Louis the latter half of this week, will be the largest and most representative gathering of peace advocates ever held in the western world. Eighty separate organizations, all of which aim to bring about the substitution of arbitration for war in the settlement of international disputes, will participate in the congress. In addition to the delegates representing these societies, the participants will include numerous members of the United States Congress, governors of States, mayors of cities, foreign diplomats and other persons of prominence in public affairs.

The sessions of the congress will begin Thursday and continue until the end of the week. On the day preceding the opening of the congress the delegates will take part in elaborate exercises attending the dedication of the Jefferson Memorial. This memorial, erected at the edge of Forest Park at a cost of \$500,000, is to commemorate the Louisiana Purchase the greatest peaceable acquisition of territory in the history of the world. The day selected for the dedication will be the 110th anniversary of the signing of the Louisiana Purchase treaty, which secured to the United States the vast territory extending from the west bank of the Mississippi River to the summit of the Rocky Mountains.

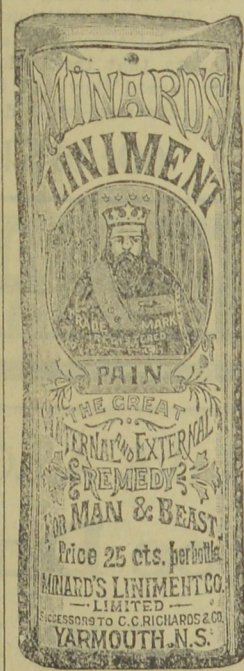

### THE FOX INDUSTRY OF P. E. I. ISLAND

The fox industry still continues to boom on the Island. Every day brings forth more interesting news to furnish material for golden dreams on the part of the investors. This is the critical season as the young are now arriving. There is always a certain infant mortality in foxes as in domestic animals, and it would be strange indeed if some losses were not heard of. Some have been reported but it must be remembered that there are twice the number of foxes in captivity today than there was a year ago, and the percentage of losses is smaller. A number of the fox men are objecting to the bill just passed by the Legislature, taxing each season's increase at the rate of 1 per cent. on their value. They declare this legislation hasty and ill-advised with a tendency to keep out foreign capital. Prospects of the industry for 1914 are exceedingly bright, and inquiries from various coming in, notwithstanding that our ranchers have so far done little or no advertising over there. Some capitalists in Sweden are sending a representative to the Island, who will arrive about the first of June to study the business and learn how to handle the animals. At present the ranches are all closed to visitors for disturbance would be liable to cause heavy losses, as Mrs. Fox is very sensitive about her young. 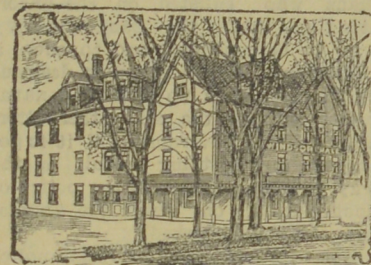

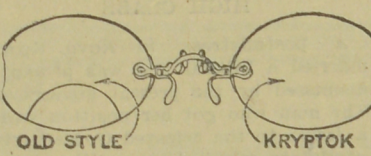

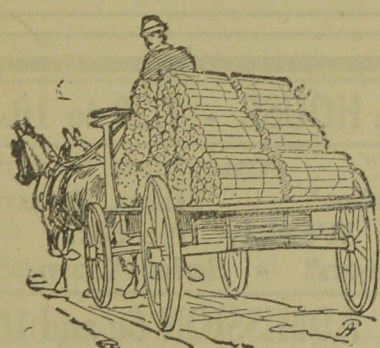
