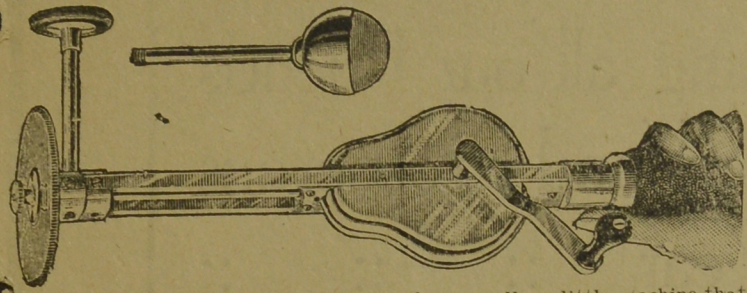

Most of our men are in the woods. Some with Rogers, some with Grey and a few with Schriver Bros.

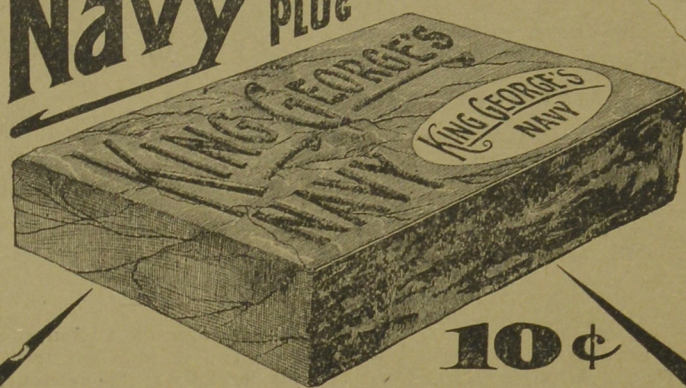
Mr. and Mrs. Albian Schriver are wearing smiling faces over the arrival of a large baby boy.
