### SAUSAGE MAKING IS NOW A SCIENCE

New York, Jan. 22—Some queer news about the making of sausages was furnished by M. Calm, secretary of Preservaline Manufacturing Company, in Lorimer street, Brooklyn. This company makes lard bleacher, meat preservatives, board's head binders, smoke substitutes, pyrocol, vegetable zanzarine, preservaline and so forth, for chopping meat, Hamburger steak, frankfurters, Bologna and other smoked sausage. Mr. Calm thought he was talking to a dealer when he spoke as follows:

"We make tons of these things and have ten thousand names of pork

packers on our books who use them constantly."

"Are they all legal?" was asked. "No," he admitted, "but we ship great quantities to Canada, Mexico and South America, where there are no food laws against them. Lake our zanzarine, for instance. The government has forbidden its use in inspected establishments, but other fellows use great quantities of it and don't seem to get into trouble."

"We make zanzarine old style, new style and also in purified form, which we call pyrocol. In fact, our pyrocol is refined now to a state where it shows only one part of arsenic to the million. The stuff used by some candy makers contains more than twice as much arsenic, or one part to 400,000."

## WHICH WOULD YOU SAVE FROM A FIRE---A HUMAN BABY OR A GREAT PAINTING?

(By Charles H. Pennoyer)

We imagine a great fire in a home or public hall, where an invaluable painting hangs and an infant child lies, and there is but a chance to save one. Which shall it be? We must instantly decide. The world calls for moral judgment as its greatest asset, because truly leading to adequate action. There are practical situations, too, where stern reality shows similar case, where business men and others are between the sacrifice demanded for child welfare and the worldly success which temperately seems to call for obscuring this social good. The question is not an other worldly one with us, not depending on christening, but on this world's present time duties on its own account.

We waive the question of extreme defects, because that is not fair to our problem. Because people, who raise this issue, bring it up when there is no fire. We must assume that the child is such an one as should be saved whether there is no fire at all, and thus not get lost on another line.

The picture involved, is assumed to be one which cannot be replaced, is a treasure of art, has value invaluable. Lovers of beauty will go into mourning if the painting is lost. Artists will sorrow, and eulogies and eulogies will fill the public prints. We speak of the lost arts, and with the loss of this masterpiece will go out a very type of art, clean-gone forever. This is in our consciousness at that critical moment.

It occurs to you that it would be easier to decide if it were a case of an exceptional child versus an exceptional painting, an embryonic Shakespear or Emerson or Lincoln or Ballo versus the masterpiece. Certain artists, emphasizing that the child's life is uncertain, and probably would be average only, have said "they would save the great painting."

Right here it may be noted that that very child may become great, as manger children, and infants born in the most promising circumstances, do grow to be great sometimes. We may hesitate in bringing into existence a new line of descent, but it is vital that we touch not a line of descent already begun, because out of that ancestry may arise greatness and genius. This is all the more likely, too, if we but realize that environment is even more important than heredity in bringing about service, which is the element of greatness.

But why not make just this exception? We were supposed to tell you at the start that the child was not your own. But what business under the golden rule, have you to ask such a question? It is somebody's child. Universalism comes to the rescue, and makes the unanswerable inquiry "How dare you make a single exception ever?" Some family is, or should be, interested, and we are the guardians of that family's right at that instant. Democracy is coming to insist on no exceptions whatever, as the only adequate ideal. Once admit one case where an exception, and where would it lead us? Democracy and the whole race are involved in our right decision. It is a universal instance, an illustration of the democracy of Universalism, and of the Universalism of democracy.

We thus come upon the inhumanity of certain second rate artists. To business we have said, "How much better is a man than a sheep?" "Now it is to artists "How much better is a man than a picture?" "Even on materialist grounds the child has incalculable possibilities as a reproductive agent. But along side of that external painting, is an internal picture of exalted moral idealism, and it is but just to ask which can we most afford to lose. To lose the humanist ideal would be tragedy! What is the painting but a kind of copy, or but a human work? While the child represents the painter race itself, the mankind who appreciates and works. The child is God's more direct work.

When it comes into human relation art is but a means; then man himself is the end? Art is no more the end than is ecclesiasticism. The Sabbath is for man, church is for man, and art is for man, and the child is the man-representative. Art for art's sake is alright within limits, but when it comes into human relations it is barbarous to continue that motto. We speak of the people's right to art these days, the universal right to beauty. If that is true, then who has the right, that is universal man, he it is who is the lord of it all, at least for human beings.

It involves the greatest art to see all this. Life is art at its highest. To be all matured, art must include the human element; and must include it as the supreme or leading value.

The child is the original picture of all pictures, from the greatest handiwork of the Divine. It is God's masterpiece. It takes us into God's sanctuary as being sculptured out of the meant to be holiest relations, and holding in its mystery the fullest beauties of the unseen.

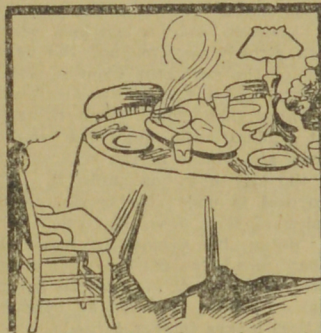
We will save the child! Surely! We cannot afford to allow exceptions.

Because exceptions would too easily multiply to the easy going conscience and exceptions cannot be made as against one child more than against another. The golden rule reminds us that we must be guided by our elemental instinct and sense of right. In the democracy of Universalism, no child is above another; and every child's lot is at stake in the welfare and reputation of each and every other. It is but treason to the race not to decide in favor of saving the child. The very reflex influence of allowing anyone or another child to be excepted, this is bad for home-life and bad for practical citizenship, bad for inter-personal duty and solitude.

Infant mortality must be lessened, because to every good citizen, another's child is not less our civic interest than his own. We will save the child, rather than the picture, because there is something more valuable and sacred than a masterpiece of painting, and that is the most beautiful thing in all our age-long appreciation, even a child. A baby is God's greatest message for us, God's greatest art with us, God's greatest responsibility for us. Neglect here is far more vital than neglect to a painting. At its best a painting represents man's works, we repeat, while the baby represents man himself. The baby is greater than the picture. The humblest babe is more valuable than the most celebrated valuable than the most celebrated masterpiece. "Suffer the little children to come unto me."
