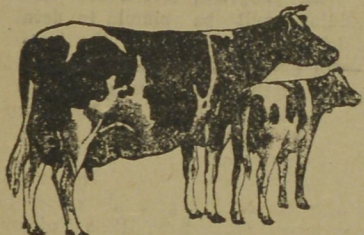

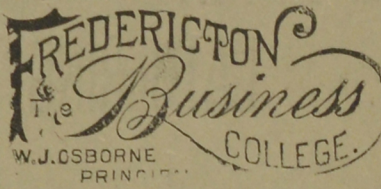

Rumor says that Mr. Sandy Mazerall is thinking about getting a patent on a new horse-shoe that he has invented for climbing hills that are short but sweet.

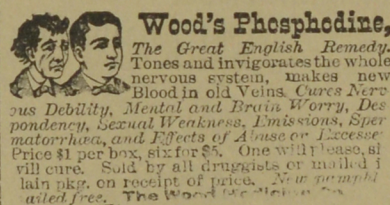
Miss Ethel Murphy has taken charge of our school for the ensuing term.

GOVERNMENT'S PAY-ROLL OVER \$13,000 PER DAY

Ottawa, Can. 20.—The first volume of the auditor general's report for the past fiscal year, tabled in the Commons tonight, contains in its thousand or more pages of detailed expenditures a few odd items of special interest.

There was but one over-ruling of Auditor General Fraser by the Treasury Board during the year. Mr. Fraser could find in the notes of last session no warrant of the payment of bounties to Fenian Raid veterans, and declined to advance a letter of credit of \$200,000 to the Finance Department therefore. The Justice Department found authority in the Fenian Raid Volunteer Bounty Act, and the Treasury Board thereupon gave the necessary authority for the bounty payments.

The summary of expenditures of the year, totalling \$131,046,764, of which \$97,618,003 was on capital account, shows that the civil service salary list amounted to \$1,798,534, and thus the government's pay-roll is over \$13,000 per day. The members of the Commons cost the country for indemnity and travelling expenses \$809,401, and the senators cost \$319,213. The general election cost \$128,392, which represents the first charge on the country for putting the present government in power.

The Militia Department spent \$7,558,235, and for arts, agriculture and statistics the expenditure was \$2,771,036, of which \$1,204,614 went to the Census Branch. For the naval service proper, including maintenance of the cruisers Niobe and Rainbow, the training college at Halifax and the upkeep of the dockyards at Esquimaux and Halifax, the total amount spent was \$1,233,456.

Canada's total pension bill for the year was \$222,620, of which \$45,697 was under the militia pensions act of 1901.

The largest single item of expenditure was for the National Transcontinental Railway, viz., \$21,110,683. Public works expenditure, chargeable to income, was \$10,290,985, although the vote was over \$18,000,000. On capital account the expenditure of the department was \$2,948,922. The government's advertising bill to newspapers throughout the country totalled \$44,123, while nearly a million more was distributed for printing and lithographing.

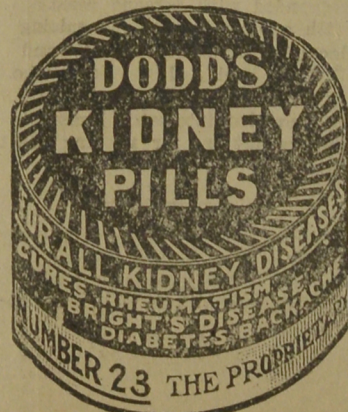
Mr. Alex. Goodine and Mr. Chas Mazerall spent Tuesday evening last with Mr. Napoleon Thomas.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

The City of Fredericton will present at the approaching Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick the following bills for enactment:

(1) A Bill authorizing the City to grant certain concessions to the Palmer-McLellan Company, Limited, and to fix the valuation of the property of Frasers Limited in this City for taxation purposes.

(2) A Bill to authorize the issue of Debentures for the erection of a Fire Station, a Police Station, for the purchase of Queen's Park and for the further construction of Permanent Street Pavements, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000).

(3) A Bill to provide for lighting by electricity the Fredericton and St. Mary's Highway Bridge.
