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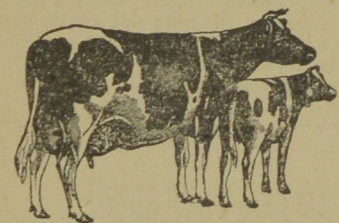

**PERPENDICULAR DRINKING  
AND ATTENDANT EVILS**

(Montreal Herald)

"Abolish the bar!" is the slogan of the Liberal party in Ontario. "Down with perpendicular drinking!" echoes the temperance party in Massachusetts. "Perpendicular" drinking, be it understood, is that indulged in while standing before a long counter, usually with one foot resting on a brass rod.

Mr. Rowell and his followers in our sister province are not of course stopping short at the actual bar room; they propose to deal a sore blow at clubs, and to chase from their comfortable chairs in the little rooms behind the bar, all those bibulous gentlemen who may be taking their toddy in that way.

The chairman of the Boston licensing board has put his finger on one of the most potent causes of successive drinking in America. The bar room is largely an American development. It seems to have been designed to afford the minimum of comfort to the man who enters it, while at the same time giving the biggest returns to its owner. It might be argued that the discomfort of a bar would be the best preventive of drinking; the very reverse had been proved to be the case. In Europe where waiters move about among small tables, where there is leisure, comparative quiet, and often good music where conversation is possible and the surroundings are more or less congenial the patronage may be greater, but the amount of liquor consumed is unquestionably less. In panacea. This was advanced by the

"Abolish the treat" is another far circumstance in a European cafe. America, with our remarkable treating tradition in full blast, the amount of liquor consumed by each individual who enters the bar accompanied by friends is probably several times greater than it would be under similar circumstances of Ontario at the last session of the Legislature more as a counter-blast to the Liberal cry than with any hope of its enforcement. The State of Iowa has actually enacted legislation making it a misdemeanor punishable by fine for one man to offer drink to another in a public drinking place. Iowa saloon keepers are declaring that it will mean the cutting of their business in two. They need not worry; it is most improbable that the law can be enforced effectively.

It remains to be seen whether people can be legislated into sobriety. Public sentiment grows stronger each day against the excessive use of intoxicants, but until the time comes when its rising tide shall have swept the whole business of retail liquor selling out of existence, we shall probably have the "perpendicular drink" and the treat right in our midst.

**TO INVESTIGATE  
THE EGG TRADE**

During the past year the Live Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture has been engaged in a preliminary investigation of the Canadian Egg Trade. Certain facts relating to the enormous loss that is charged back against the farmer and the unsatisfactory status of the trade as a whole have been collected and presented in Bulletin No. 16, entitled "The Care of Market Eggs." Realizing, however, the necessity of securing more detailed information before inaugurating any policy having for its object the bringing about of improvement in the condition of the business, the Minister of Agriculture has authorized the appointment of J. H. Hare, B. S. A., of Whitby, to undertake the necessary investigation.

Mr. Hare has held the position of District Representative in Ontario County, Ont., for the past four years. He was born at Cobourg, Ont., and received his early training on the farm. He entered the Ontario Agriculture College in 1904 and graduated in 1908. Since taking up the District Representative work in Ontario County he has devoted much time and has been very successful in the organization of co-operative egg circles. Not only has he paid particular attention to conditions of the egg trade as they exist in the rural districts, but he has also made a close study of poultry business in general and has written numerous articles, among which is a bulletin now in preparation of his technical training and his practical experience Mr. Hare is, therefore, well qualified as a specialist in poultry work.

Mr. Hare will first be concerned with the collection of all data that is available on the grading of eggs as they have been received at wholesale produce houses of Canada during the past two years. The information thus obtained will be used to form a basis for such action as may be taken by the Government in initiating a movement to improve and properly regulate the trade.

Mr. Hare will be located at Ottawa, but will travel extensively throughout the Dominion, first in the east and later in the west.
