ally in line with the fixed charges in the St. John General Public Hospital. The report of the committee was adopted.

With the band-quarters removed from the ground floor additional space can be used for company armories and by a few alterations the armory space for each company can be about doubled.

Lt. Col. the Hon. H. F. McLeod, whose tenure of command of the 71st York Regt. will expire next spring and Capt. P. A. Guthrie, chairman of the band committee of the regiment waited upon the members of the band last night and discussed the contemplated improvements and other matters. When the alterations are completed the 71st Regt. Band will have first class quarters.

WANT PLANS CHANGED

Before other business was undertaken the board received the delegation from the medical staff and at once entered into a discussion of the sketch plans submitted by Architect Brodie. The President assured the delegates that the Board would welcome the fullest discussion and at the same time appreciate any assistance extended by the staff.

Dr. VanWart said that he and his associates, Dr. Weaver and Dr. Holden had carefully studied the plans submitted by Mr. Brodie and they had arrived at the conclusion that several changes should be made. These were named and called for considerable re-adjustment. A list of suggested changes was submitted and to all the alterations these gentlemen were agreed.

MAY ORDER NEW PLANS

After an extended conference the delegation withdrew and the Trustees were in sympathy with the suggestions as presented and after a discussion of ways and means the plans were placed in charge of Messrs. McMurray, Clark and VanDine, and if they deem it advisable will order a new set of plans to include suggested changes. In order to secure a brick structure which will serve as a nucleus for an entirely new hospital some twelve or fifteen thousand dollars will be needed. Some of the physicians declare that when the people of Fredericton properly understand the situation the money will be forthcoming.

After routine business including the ordering of payment of a number of bills the meeting adjourned.

CLAIM BOLL WEEVIL
HAS BEEN CONQUERED

New Orleans, July 8.—The Government experts here are of the belief that the boll weevil is no longer a serious menace to cotton. Despite the large number of weevils this year Louisiana and Mississippi bid fair to produce record crops. Careful attention is declared to be the secret of the victory over the pest. By this is meant the keeping of the fields clear of litter and rubbish, picking off the punctured bolls and burning them and exposing as much of the plant to the sun as possible. This latter is accomplished by leaving more space between rows and plants and by trimming out as much of the plant as possible to prevent too much weed. The farmers generally appear to have followed the advice of the government experts along these lines. Even the negro farmers seem to have learned that it is money in their pockets to keep their fence corners cleaned up so that they will not afford harboring places for over-the-winter weevils.

THEFT AT DOUGLAS BOOM

Another case of robbery is reported from the Douglas Boom. It is said that a person or persons unknown opened a suit-case belonging to a man working there and stole ten dollars. The man was left with fifteen cents and left at once for his home saying that the thieves "would not get what he still had. This theft took place last week following immediately another that occurred there.

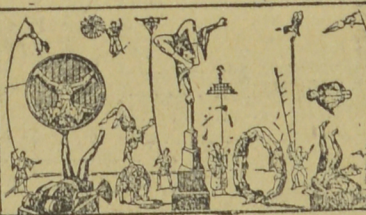
