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### A USELESS PREFERENCE

One of the ironic triumphs of the present session at Ottawa has been the extension of the British Preference to Darkest Africa and a number of British islands in various tropical seas generally known as the "Cannibal Isles." Most of these places are only known to explorers and geographers. But the British Preference had been created by the Laurier Government, and it had to be tinkered with some way, so Hon. Mr. Foster decided to give the dusky natives of Swaziland, Basutoland, Bechuanaland, Northern Rhodesia, Nyasaland, Uganda, Nigri, Gold Coast, Sierra Leone, Gambia, Somaliland, Bornso, Sarawak, Brunei, Maritius, Seychelles, St. Helena, Ascension, Tonga Islands and the Falklands the benefits of the reduced tariff. So far it is not known that this announcement has caused much excitement amongst the savages of Africa or even of the Fiji Islands, the latter so far as records go being about the only one of all the districts named with which Canada has done any trade and this only to the extent of \$192,914 worth of sugar last year. This masterpiece of Hon. George E. Foster has been whimsically dubbed a convention for the promotion of trade between Ungava to Uganda and to stimulate the exchange of such natural products as icebergs and sunstrokes. Possibly under the new arrangement missionnaires, discarded rifles and gin may also be exported to the Cannibal Isles.

### ROGERS THE "SYNCHRONIZER"

It has always been the claim of the Liberals that there should be no pooling of interests between the Dominion and Provincial governments. Out of power the Tories subscribed to this wise doctrine, but they have never refrained from getting any partly advantage they could from such coalitions. Until now the ordinary man would call it Hon. W. T. White calls it "synchronizing." By an odd synchronizing just before the Saskatchewan Provincial elections it was announced through Hon. Robert Rogers, who was engineering the Tory work there, that the duty on cement had been cut for the benefit of the west. During the provincial by-election in Antigonish, N.S., by a similar "synchronizing," announcement was made in the local press of a long list of public works for the riding in advance of the regular publication of the estimates, which was an unprecedented piece of political daring. These coincidences "synchronize" with the promise of a railroad to Richelieu if it would return a Tory last fall. Hon. Mr. Rogers seems to have a peculiar knack of synchronizing with every piece of bold political chicanery that is pulled off on behalf of Premier Borden.

The action of Mr. Pinder and his two colleagues in crossing over to the opposition side of the House has been described as a fine piece of strategy. They are not at all satisfied with the treatment they have been receiving from the government of late and threaten to make trouble if certain demands which they propose making are not given favorable consideration. It looks as if Premier Flemming will in the end have to act on the advice he tendered the members for Madawaska and capitulate.

"I have a suspicion," said Mr. Carvell in his speech on the C.P.R. strike, "that if the minister of labor were as anxious to force the Canadian Pacific Railway to take back these men as he was to force the Grand Trunk to take its men back—and agreed to hold up legislation until they did it—there would be no difficulty in having the men restored to their position. The position of the minister is remarkable when you compare his conduct in this case with that in the case of the Grand Trunk strike."

The Speech from the Throne delivered at the opening of the N. S. Legislature on Thursday promises measures for improved highways, cheap rural telephones and sanitariums for the treatment of tuberculosis. They certainly have a progressive government in the sister province.

The bill to provide a sinking fund for the redemption of the public debt was handled in the House yesterday by Premier Flemming. Under former governments it was customary for the provincial secretary to look after matters of this kind.

We never suspected Premier Flemming with being possessed of a sense of humor until he proposed the Honorable Walter Burnham Dickson, Tory organizer, for the chairmanship of the Committee on Ways and Means.

What is Premier Flemming going to do this session towards providing the people of the rural districts with cheaper telephones.
