DOG TAXES

The attention of owners of dogs within the City limits is directed to he following provisions of the City By-law relating to dogs:-

Every owner of a dog shall register such dog at the office of the City Treasurer on or before the FIRST DAY OF AUGUST in each year the tax or fee for each registration shall be ONE DOLLAR, which must be paid to the City Treasurer before registration."

"The owner of any male dog who has not registered it on or before the first day of August as aforemaid may register such dog at any time up to the first day of September next succeeding on payment to the City Treasurer a tax or fee of TWO OLLARS; but if such registration is not made until after the first day of September and previous to the first day of January next succeeding

The tax or fee for female dogs is and proceed fixed at FOUR DOLLARS if not law provided. registered before August first and at
