INTERNATIONAL FISHERY CONGRESS

THE BORDEN GOVERNMENT AND I. C. R. FREIGHT RATES

(Moncton Transcript)
The Borden Government crawls down.

It is still crawling. It is ever ready to crawl. It will eat humble pie or any other kind of pie, so long as it can hold on to its salaries.

It is not troubled about principles, because it has not any principles to be troubled about.

A few weeks since it made radical changes in the I. C. R. freight rates. It even went so far against the report of its own Board of I. C. R. Management as to increase the freight rates, and even increased the minimum freight rate from twenty-five cents per hundred pounds to thirty-five cents.

There was a storm raised instantly throughout the Maritime Provinces.

The Liberal newspapers championed the cause of the people.

They pointed out that with a \$800,000 surplus on the I. C. R., there was no justification for increasing these rates, and in consequence of this attitude by the Liberal press, the agitation against the Government grew to such stupendous proportions that the Tory members of Parliament became frightened and threats of their resignations were held as postals to the heads of the members of the Government, and then the Government wilted.

Today, August 15th, there went into effect on the Intercolonial Railway the following withdrawal of the increase of forty per cent on the minimum I. C. R. freight charge:—

The above is a great victory for the Liberal newspapers, which championed the people's interests, but the Government cannot stop here.

It is not sufficient for the Government to rescind its order increasing the freight rates there is another obvious duty before the Government.

The rescinding of an order is an admission by the Government that the order was unjustifiable, that it embodied a wrong, that it obtained from the people, under pressure, money to which the Government was not entitled.

It has collected thousands of dollars up and down the line of the Intercolonial Railway in an unjust and excessive rate as a minimum charge.

It has collected thirty-five cents instead of twenty-five cents per hundred lbs.

When is the Government going to make restitution to the people?

It has no right to keep the money in its pockets, which it has filched unjustly from the freight payers.

Every farmer, every merchant, every business man, every resident along the line of the Intercolonial Railway, who has paid thirty-five cents as a minimum charge during the past few weeks, has paid ten cents too much, and it is the government's duty to refund that money.

Now, Mr. Borden and Mr. Cochrane, pay back the ten cents and look pleasant.

You have no right to keep that money in the Dominion Treasury, having unjustly collected it, according to your own admission.

When are you going to pay the money back? Every body in the country, who has paid ten cents too much as a minimum charge, should demand an immediate refund.

Versailles, Ky., Aug. 19—Every man, woman and child on Johnson N. Camden's four-thousand acre estate in Woodford county, not far from here, is busy today with the preparations for tomorrow, when the millionaire owner of the estate expects to be host to an army of probably twenty thousand Kentucky farmers and their wives. The invitation was extended to all farmers and farmers' wives of Kentucky, but it is believed that not more than twenty thousand will accept Mr. Camden's hospitality. 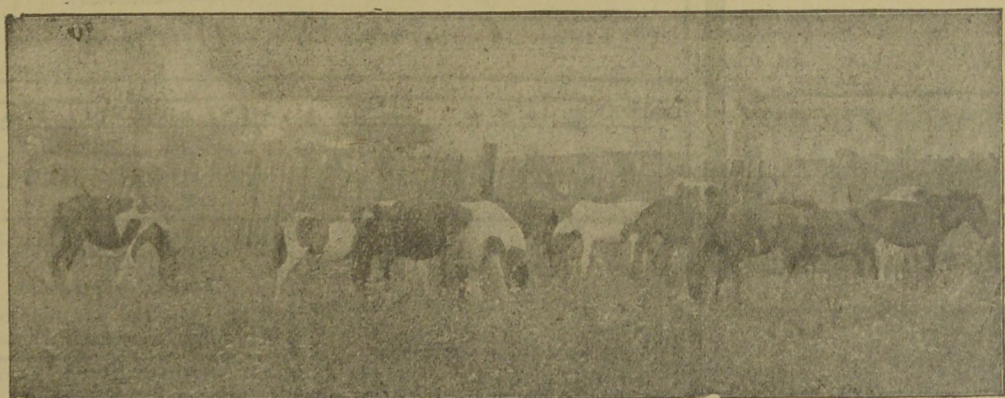
