It is stated, however, that the City Clerk will not ask for \$2,000 per year as has been reported in certain quarters. Few changes among city officials are expected but it is reported that Mr. R. H. Boone may resume the office of Municipal Home Commissioner. The friends of Mr. Thos. Niles, present incumbent, say, however, that he will hold the position.

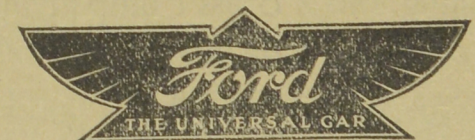
