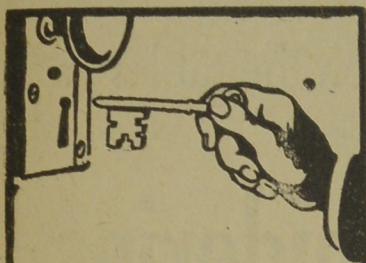

members is involved. It is said that the board's failure to make any arbitration offer is due to Cobb's refusal to sanction such a move, as Cobb asserts there is nothing to arbitrate. measure and he considered it would facilitate its passing through the House.

TO AID CORRUPTION

Hon. Mr. Emmerson delivered a vigorous and telling speech, arraigning the course of the Government in plain-spoken language. "These are blood-purchased rights," said he, "which the Government would now abolish or curtail till they reach the vanishing point. If it were designed to buttress a corrupt and vicious government which intended to loot the treasury of Canada, no better measure could have been devised."

"I hold that the rules of Parliament should be framed by Parliament itself," reasoned Hon. Mr. Emmerson. "It is the prerogative of Parliament and not of the Cabinet. The Government have no right to usurp the powers of Parliament and thus seek to frame rules to govern Parliament whose servants they are. Admittedly this measure is framed by the Government, and Parliament is not consulted and admittedly Parliament is expected to be bound by rules so framed."

RIGHTS OF THE PEOPLE

Mr. E. M. Macdonald of Pictou, stated that the new rules involved the limitation of the rights of the minority. These rights had heretofore not been fixed by the majority but by Parliament usage from 1867 to the present day. Parliament was intended to be the political court of appeal before which the humblest and the highest in the land could be arraigned and by closure the Government was taking away from the aggrieved the right of such a tribunal.

It was all very well for the Minister of Finance to say that the people wanted to see the flow of discussion checked, but Mr. Macdonald was inclined to think that if Hon. Mr. White had received any such encouragement from outside the House, it came from friends of the Government who were anxious that certain things should not be exposed.

"If discussion is to be cut off for the benefit of office seekers or patronage hunters then indeed Canada has fallen into evil ways," declared the Pictou member.

MACHINE GOVERNMENT

Every person engaging in the occupation of a Baker is also required to file with the City Clerk on or before the first day of May next "a record of his name, together with the initial letter or letters, or label, which he intends to use to designate the bread made or sold by him."

in a minority and must then meet the recoil of their own actions now. The gag meant that independence of thought and action would be prostituted to the dictates of a political machine. A shackled Parliament would but register the dictates of that machine. Instead of Government of the people by the people and for the people what was now proposed was government of the machine by the machine and for the machine.

Touching on the casuistry of the Government arguments with regard to obstruction all along the line since the session opened, Mr. Macdonald briefly pointed out that Supply, the Bank Act, and every other item of business, with the exception of the Naval Bill, has been facilitated by the opposition with a minimum amount of reasonable discussion and criticism. The only reason for bringing the closure at the present juncture was to prevent further discussion of the Naval Bill and to prevent an appeal to the people in that issue.

HIS PROMISE WORTHLESS

The Premier has suavely promised that after Parliament was bound the Government would handle it only with silken gloves and Closure would only be enforced under extreme provocation. "We don't believe him," he said. "We don't expect anything from him on promise. This is the man who goes back on every declaration he made in 1908 with regard to the right of the minority to freely express their views and will go down to history as the man who took away the right of a free people to demand redress of their grievances before granting supply."

BUREAUCRATIC RULE

It has been said, he continued, that Canada was practically the only country in which Parliament had not adopted Closure, but there was no Closure in Germany, France or Spain. In Britain conditions were vastly different since there the Imperial House had to deal with a vast number of local issues which in Canada would be dealt with by the Local Legislatures. He quoted authoritative expressions of opinion from Washington declaring that the Closure in the Congress had undoubtedly destroyed individuality and initiative in regard to legislation and had tended to Government by the few. The present measure was a combination of the Russian and British Closures.

A COSTLY ALLIANCE.

The whole farce has been perpetrated by the Nationalist-Conservative combination who, in order to continue their dishonest alliances in regard to the naval issue, were now imposing coercion on the people of Canada and compelling them to pay \$35,000,000 as the price of their alliance. For this they had no mandate from the people. Twenty-one supporters of the government from Quebec had been pledged against the naval proposals and in Ontario and other parts of the Dominion hardly a word had been said at the last election by the men who now constituted the government in regard to the navy. Yet when the opposition demanded some explanation of the terms on which Nationalists and Conservatives had got together and some real justification for the contribution they had been met only by silence.

"Parliamentary rules and specialties have become a thing of the past in the attitude shown by the Premier and his followers in the various stages of the naval debate up to the introduction of this tyrannical 'Tory proposition,'" said Mr. Macdonald. "It will be the proud satisfaction of

every man on this side of the House that they took part in the fight of March 15, when Liberalism showed its resentment to any curtailment of the right of free speech.

If any municipal council attempted to make rules governing its own actions such as the rules proposed by this government, they would be declared illegal and invalid by any court in the country.

DOWN WITH RUSSIANISM.

"I hope the senate will assert itself and throw out the navy bill, which has not the sanction of parliament and will be forced through by closure. Will the premier keep his pledge and go to the country if the senate throws out the navy bill? That's the question. The people will watch to see if he is a man of his word."

Every minority in Canada, whether it is religious, territorial or of any character, is to be hampered by this coercion measure. But the chickens will come home to roost and it would be only just retribution if the government has to face this creature of its own creation, and that time may not be far distant.

The people will revolt at the idea that we are to have any Russian Douma in this country presided over by a Czar, whose promises, though fair, are not to be trusted.

Let him go to the country. We on this side of the House welcome the issue as soon as possible."

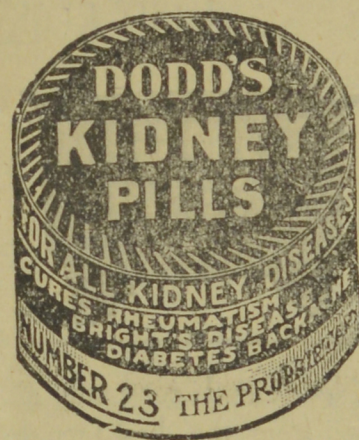
TORONTO FLUNKYISM.

After an indignant speech by Dr. Clark at midnight the House divided upon the motion by Minister of Marine Hazen "that the question be now put." Amid Liberal jeers it was carried on a straight party division by 108 to 73, a majority of 35. Premier Borden's Nationalist supporters remained faithful to him and all voted with him.
