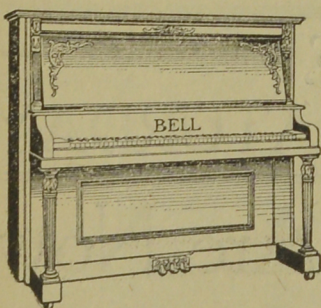

## RIVER STEAMER SERVICE MATTER OF IMPORTANCE

No Move Yet For Resumption of Fredericton-Gagetown Service--- Merchants Much Interested

Now that the interests of Fredericton are the special care of an active Board of Trade, a business query that has been rife among the merchants of the city is "What is going to be done about the steamboats between Fredericton and Gagetown and between Fredericton and St. John?" Although the former is the shorter of the routes in which this city is concerned, it is considered as of first importance to its trade, the line in fact being dependent for its existence on the accommodating time-table between Fredericton and Gagetown terminals; while immediate freight and passenger traffic supply a great part of the steamship business for the through line from Fredericton and St. John. Considerable concern is felt over the fact that since the death of the late manager of the Gagetown service, the question of what will be done with the steamboat property as an asset of the estate, is the paramount one for the executors,—not, how is Fredericton going to fare for steamer on the line to Gagetown.

The season has approached when half the preparations of the "Hamstead" were usually about completed; but this year it is said nothing has yet been done for the steamer's outfit. For three years the Hamstead has had a subsidy of \$500, and with that it is said she could not pay expenses notwithstanding which the late Dr. L. A. Currey, who was a native of Gagetown, continued to keep her on the line. Last year Dr. Currey held back till he secured an increase of \$300, and that was the first time the Hamstead paid expenses on the route.

It appears nothing has been done in the way of government subsidy this year; and the result is a pretty blue outlook for city trade and city passenger traffic to Gagetown and points between. A situation that is surely worthy of the prompt attention of both the City Council, the Board of Trade, and all parties interested. The railway-building going on down river now makes the need greater than ever for a good service on this line—if the time is too late to get the very best, then the best available.

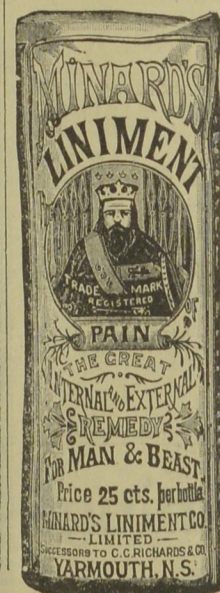

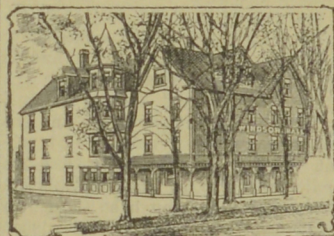
