## GREAT NORTHERN'S HUGE PROJECT

construction work was started today on the Chelan River power-plant, the central feature in the colossal plans of the Great Northern Railway to electrify its lines throughout this section of the Northwest. The project calls for the construction of a dam which is expected to be one of the engineering wonders of America. The cost of the entire power-plant will be close to \$10,000,000. It will develop about 100,000 horsepower. This will be sufficient to electrify not only the up-river branch of the Great Northern, but all of its main lines east of the Cascades to Spokane.
