Once more tonight Hon. "Bob" Rogers discovered the inefficiency of "ward politics," as applied to Canada's parliament. When the third reading of the bill providing Canadian concurrence in the Anglo-Japanese treaty was put to the House tonight, following the loss on division of the second amendment offered by Hon. Messrs. Pugsley and Emmerson along the same lines as the Oliver amendment, the minister of public works, noting that a number of the Liberal members had left for their homes on trains, called for a division. The division bells accordingly sounded and the members were summoned. Meanwhile Hon. "Bob" sat smiling at the prospect of the snap vote and an augmented government majority.

As soon as Premier Borden and Chief Whip Stanfield of the Conservatives, took their places, Mr. Carvell, acting whip for the Liberals, in the absence of Fred Pardee, who had left to spend the week-end at his home, crossed the floor and drew attention to the agreement entered into on behalf of the Liberals by Mr. Pardee, and on behalf of the Conservatives by Mr. Stanfield on the latter's suggestion, that, to enable members to catch their trains there should be no divisions after six o'clock tonight.

The making of this arrangement Mr. Stanfield at once confirmed, and Premier Borden was under the necessity of asking Mr. Speaker to declare the motion carried without the division which Hon. "Bob" had sought to precipitate. The speaker declared accordingly and on motion of the premier the House adjourned, while the Liberals enjoyed a good laugh at the discomfited minister of public works.

Bucksport Me., Apr. 1.—Bucksport's famous April fool joke made its 44th annual appearance today with marked success and many citizens observed its anniversary as usual.

In 1869 the late James F. Moses, landlord of the village tavern moved the box-like storm porch which opens into the hotel office from the veranda to one side of the door so that people going in came in contact with the dead wall.






Two of the New Sulkeys.
