## DR. A. J. MURRAY CALLED TO HIS REWARD

Fredericton Junction, N. B., April 3-Dr. Angus J. Murray passed away at 1 o'clock this afternoon at his residence here after an illness extending over some months.

He had been in poor health for a year, suffering ir m pulmonary tuberculosis, and had been bedridden since the day before Christmas.

Dr. Murray was born at Loganville Pictou County, Nova Scotia, October 23, 1855, the eldest son of John and Nancy Murray.

He began his medical studies in the Halifax Medical College, now Dalhousie College, passing his primary exams, there in 1874. His health failing, he went west, finally drifting back to Chicago, where in 1883 he graduated from what is now known as the Medical Department of the University of Illinois. Coming east, he began his professional career at Greenwich, Kings County, N. B., and practiced there for five years with great acceptance. In 1887 he was married to Mary S. McKay, daughter of John McKay, Earltown, N. S.


