Outfielder Lelivelt of the Cleveland Naps, is hitting with the .300 set this season.



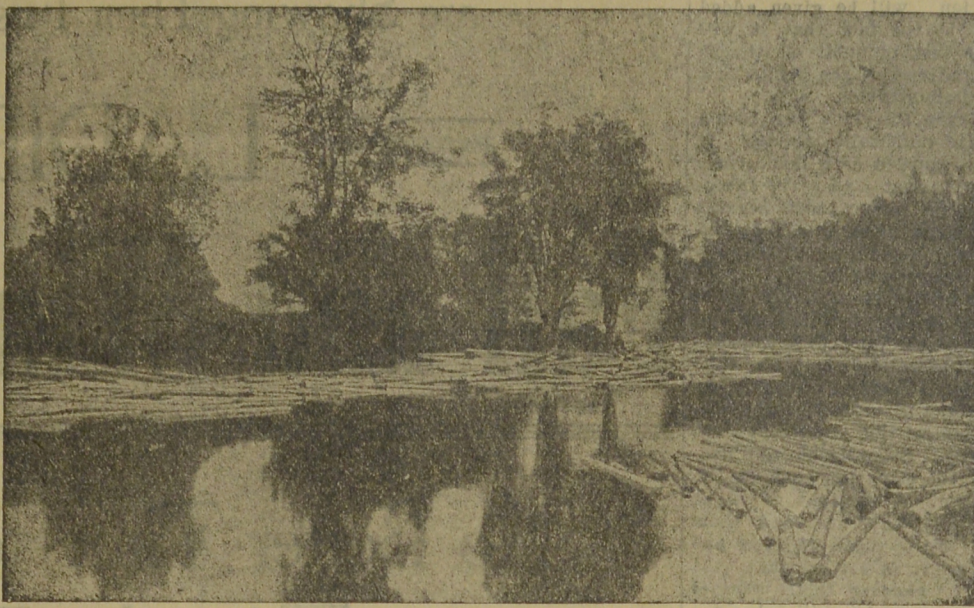

NEW ZEALAND IS NOW ON HER WAY

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 11—The last interchange of courtesies between British Columbia and the battle cruiser New Zealand were performed on Saturday on board the warship just before she steamed her way to San Francisco. There were speeches by Sir Richard McBride in handing over a message sent by Mr. R. L. Borden, on behalf of Canada as a whole; by Lieutenant-Governor Patterson, in presenting a loving cup to the ship in memory of her visit to these waters, and by Captain L. Halsey in response.

Throughout the three addresses there was a strong vein of patriotic sentiment and the party of guests who were privileged to be on board at the time were not slow in appreciation.

The Lieutenant-Governor expressed his appreciation of the act of New Zealand in making a gift to the empire, which action, he believed, had created a greater and more profound impression throughout the imperial domain than any other event of recent years.

In responding on behalf of the ship, Captain Halsey spoke feelingly of the welcome accorded him in these waters and made reference to the imperial significance of such a visit.

Thousands of people, displaying the carnival spirit, were aboard craft of every conceivable size and shape following in the wake of the New Zealand as the battleship shortly after five o'clock, majestically steamed out of Esquimalt harbor to the cheers from the massed crowds.

The New Zealand will visit Halifax in October.

TRIPLE DROWNING AT SEABRIGHT, N.S.

Halifax, Aug. 12—Three lives were lost in a drowning accident at Seabright yesterday afternoon, when a sail boat overturned in a heavy squall.

From the meagre details which reached Halifax early this morning, a man named Collishaw was out sailing with his fifteen-year-old son and a three-year-old daughter and their boat overturned in a heavy squall. Assistance put out from the shore, but too late. None of the bodies had been recovered up to late last night. The accident occurred off Collishaw's Point, near the Seabright Hotel, about twenty-five miles from Halifax. Deep gloom was cast over the summer colony by the accident.

There are several families of this name at Seabright and owing to telephonic and telegraphic communication with this place ceasing very early at night, definite details could not be learned.

OPENING OF HUNTING SEASON

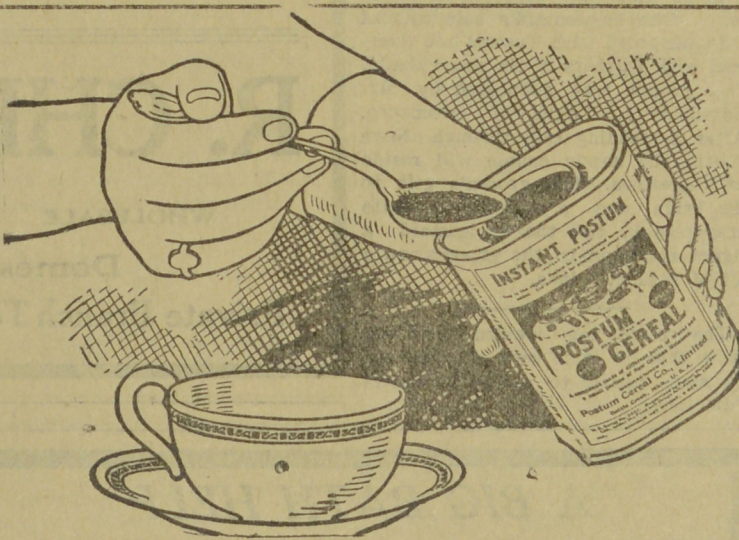
London, Aug. 12—With the close of regatta week at Cowes society folk have turned their faces toward the northern moors. Today, known to every lover of sport in the United Kingdom as the "glorious twelfth," marks the opening of the grouse hunting season. Despite the fact that the sport is enormously expensive it is more generally indulged in each successive year by English men and women of the leisure class and by not a few wealthy Americans who of late years have attracted attention by leasing some of the choicest hunting preserves. The indications are that the sportsmen will find the present season more than usually expensive. The Scottish game keepers report that grouse and quail are unusually scarce, owing to the fact that the persistent rain and cold of last spring destroyed the young. It is figured that every bird shot this season will cost the exuberant nimrod between three and four dollars.
