militia, from having its canteen. But when it is a training camp with any force of the non-permanent militia, then no intoxicating liquors may be sold. This concession was applied for this year but was promptly refused by me.

SHOULD GO WITHOUT.

"As early as May 13, this year, Col. Williams, the adjutant general, by my direction, wrote to Col. Rutherford at Halifax as follows:

"The minister desires me to point out that he distinctly wishes it to be understood that ninety-five per cent. of the British regulars can get along without the r liquors and they are nearly as good soldiers as are the soldiers of the permanent force in Canada; "The minister would, therefore, be pleased to know why there are so many men in our permanent service who insist upon having liquor in camp.

"It is also the minister's desire that some form of amusement or entertainment be provided other than sitting around camp drinking beer."

The remaining three will be used by the provincial government for demonstrating domestic science and will include a kitchen. These rooms will be so constructed that they may be turned into an auditorium or lecture room. The Ladies' Rest Room will prove a valuable addition and here every care and comfort will be extended to those enjoying its hospitality.

The Diving Girls, the greatest outside attraction on the grounds two years ago, will make their appearance again this year. Several Teddy Bear and Poodle Dog concessions have been granted and Secretary Hooper is still daily receiving communications from all parts of the United States and Canada enquiring for space on the grounds.

NEGRO WANTS PREFERENCE

Cuthbert, Ga., Aug. 13—The Georgia State Agricultural Society, the oldest organization of its kind in the south, began its sixty-eighth annual meeting here today with a large and representative attendance. President John T. Williams called the gathering to order and presided over the opening session.

The principal address of the morning was delivered by Dr. David C. Barrow, chancellor of the University of Georgia. Dr. Barrow spoke on the subject of "The Negro." He expressed regret at the tendency of the white man to give foreign laborers employment in preference to the negro. Much of the south's future, he declared, depends on the white man being able to make a faithful and efficient worker out of the negro.
