A NOTABLE FIGURE IN WESTERN CANADA

(Toronto Saturday Night)

Hon. Edward Ludlow Wetmore, who recently retired from the Chief Justiceship of the Province of Saskatchewan, his successor being Hon. F. W. G. Haultain, has for a quarter of a century been a notable figure in the life of Western Canada. A native of Fredericton, N. B., of United Empire Loyalist descent, he was prominent for years in the public affairs of New Brunswick before he went West. From 1883 to 1886 he was the leader of the Conservative Opposition in the New Brunswick Legislature. In February, 1887, he was appointed a puisne Judge of the Supreme Court of the Northwest Territories at Regina, which was the Territorial capital. A few years later he succeeded to the Chief Justiceship. Upon the creation of the Province of Saskatchewan he was made Chief Justice of that Province. Upon the organization of the University of Saskatchewan he was elected its Chancellor. Before his recent departure to spend the remainder of the winter in Victoria, B. C., the court officials from all over the Province assembled in the Court House in Regina and presented a silver cigar and cigarette box to him, filled with his favorite brands of cigars and cigarettes. The presentation was made by William Simpson, Local Registrar at Yorkton, who is the Nestor of the Civil Service in Western Canada. In his speech he recalled several humorous court incidents of the early days in the West. Mr. Simpson is a vigorous specimen of Western Canadian. He is an enthusiastic motorist, and president of the Yorkton Automobile Club.

Stillman Richardson of Marlboro, N. H., who is 92 years of age, ascribes as the reason for the excellent health that he enjoys today the fact that he has never used tobacco or intoxicants. Mr. Richardson is a lover of horses and he takes great pride in "Roxie," a horse which he has raised himself. "Roxie" is 25 years old.

LEMON SAUCE

Grate the rind from one-half a lemon and pour over it the juice of a whole lemon. Cook together a cup of granulated sugar and three table-spoonfuls of water, and when they have cooked slowly for ten minutes stir in the lemon and rind and take from the fire. Pour gradually, beating all the time, upon the yolks of three eggs that have been whipped light. Set in boiling water and stir until the mixture begins to thicken, but not long enough to curdle the eggs.


