SUFFERS BIG LOSS**

(Moncton Transcript)

The Canadian Press despatch from  
Michel, B.C., says that the store  
Trites, Wood Co., Limited, the Im-  
perial Bank building and residence  
of H. C. Lockhart were totally de-  
stroyed by fire Saturday morning.  
The loss to the Trites, Wood Co.  
alone is estimated at \$100,000. The  
origin of the fire is unknown.  
When it was feared that the town  
would be destroyed. Mr. Lockhart's  
house was blown up and this proved  
effective, as the fire fighters were all  
able to prevent any further spread  
of the flames.Mr. Eliss A. Trites, of the above  
mentioned firm is well known in  
Moncton and vicinity. He is a na-  
tive of Coverdale, Albert County,  
and went west about fifteen years  
ago. He is a brother of Mr. A. E.  
Trites of Salisbury, and also of  
Mrs. W. A. McDougall of Moncton.  
His firm, it is understood, carried  
on business in several towns in Brit-  
ish Columbia and suffered in the big  
Ferne, B. C., conflagration some  
years ago. His friends here will re-  
gret to hear of the loss sustained  
by his firm on Saturday.**WATERWAYS CASE  
BEFORE THE COURT**Chicago, April 15—The injunction  
suit of the Government against the  
sanitary district of Chicago, involv-  
ing the pumping of water from Lake  
Michigan was called for trial in the  
Federal court here today. The peti-

been pending for several years and  
has been waiting the decision of the  
War Department recently rendered  
which denied the application of the  
sanitary board to pump an addition-  
al 10,000 cubic feet of water per sec-

**WHAT THE UPPER  
CHAMBER MAY DO**Toronto, Ont., April 14—A special  
dispatch to the Globe, from Ottawa  
says:—The closure resolution will probab-  
ly go through after a comparatively  
brief debate, just long enough to  
get the country well sized of the  
significance of the issue. Its final  
passage is certain to provoke probab-  
ly the most sensational scene in the  
history of Parliament. If the  
eighty-six representatives of Cana-  
dian Liberalism in Parliament and  
that the last resort in the Com-  
mons to stop brute force methods is  
is unsuccessful, then, they believe,  
the Senate can be relied upon to  
exercise its true function of pro-  
tecting all minorities.While no one can yet say what  
the action of the upper Chamber  
will be, it is believed that the Lib-  
eral majority there, backed by the  
Imperial Government, will not ac-  
cept the naval contribution under  
such circumstances. Even the throw-  
ing out of the naval bill by the  
Senate however, despite Premier  
Borden's flamboyant pledge at Mon-  
treal September, would not induce  
the Government to go to the coun-  
try. The Ministerialists frankly say  
that if this course is pursued by the  
Senate the Government will still  
hold on to its flesh pots, will finish  
up the other work of the ses-  
sion, then call a special session in  
September to deal with the joint  
questions of Senate reform and na-  
val contribution.But the feeling voiced by the Lib-  
eral members of the Commons is  
that the Senate will probably do  
more than merely send the naval  
bill back to the Commons. They be-  
lieve the upper Chamber would be  
justified in similar action even with  
a supply bill if forced through the  
Commons without any real debate  
and simply by brute-force methods.  
In a nutshell the situation is that  
Liberalism believes it will be just-  
ified by the people in absolute re-  
fusing to let Toryism run rampant  
carry off administration under pre-  
sent conditions.

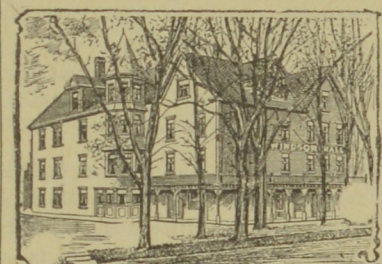

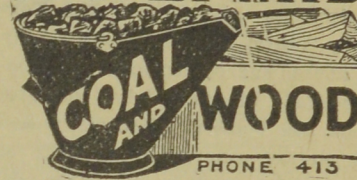
