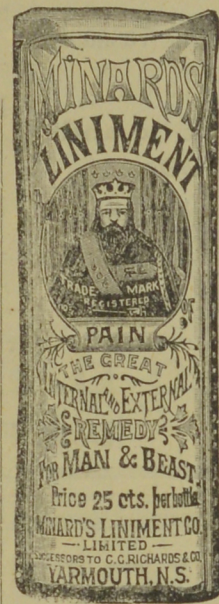

LIBERALS HAVE THE COUNTRY BEHIND THEM

Ottawa, March 6.—Since public attention was to be used on issue and its underlying principle by the dramatic deadlock in parliament the response to the Liberal demand for an appeal to the country has even exceeded the highest hopes of those engaged in the struggle.

Telegrams by the hundreds have poured in from all parts of Canada to the Liberal leaders and to their followers enthusiastically endorsing the stand taken and assuring them that the country is with them.

Yesterday Sir Wilfrid Laurier himself, received over 200 telegrams of this character and it is significant that the majority of them came from Ontario, where the Liberal defeat in September of 1911 was most severe. Several of these came from representatives of the farming and labor interests.

The old chief has been himself surprised at the signs of reaction, especially in the premier province, and the eagerness manifested there for a fight.

The only backdown now must come from the Conservative side and it is frankly admitted by many of the ministerial supporters that the party leaders made a big mistake in getting into this present predicament.

GALLINGER IS NOW DEAN OF STATE

Washington, D. C., March 7.—The Venerable Shelby M. Cullion of Illinois has closed his career in the United States senate and Jacob H. Gallinger of New Hampshire has inherited his distinction of being the oldest member of the upper house in point of service. Mr. Gallinger came to the senate in 1891, two years before the next oldest members, Perkins of California and Lodge of Massachusetts, began their senatorial careers.

Senator Nelson of Minnesota, Tillman of South Carolina, Bacon of Georgia, Martin of Virginia and Clark and Warren of Wyoming have entered upon their eighteenth year of continuous service in the senate, all having been elected for the first time in 1895.

Wyoming, unlike most other States of the Far West, continues its congressional office, and in consequence has exercised an influence in national affairs greater than many larger States. No other States has two senators whose terms of service equals those of the two Wyoming senators.

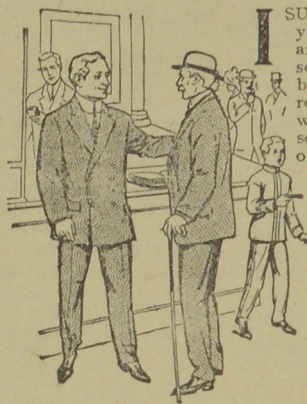

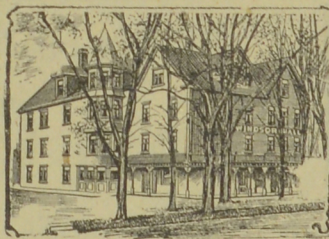

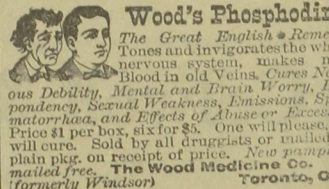
