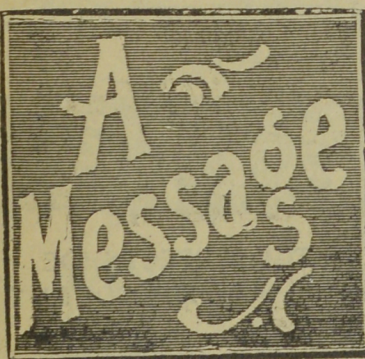

manded the main business section as well as the approach to the wharf. The strikers crowded the sidewalks in the vicinity and although some of the miners hurled taunts at the soldiers, there was no attempt to openly oppose them.

After preliminary arrangements for feeding the troops had been made by Colonel Hall, he sent his men in to breakfast, one company at a time, while other companies were posted across each end of the street approaching the blocks where the troops were massed. The entire situation is regarded as extremely critical.

The strikers are sullen, yet determined, and there have been many hurried conferences and meetings in the U. M. O. Hall since the arrival of the militia this morning. There is an air of mystery about the strikers' headquarters, and indications are that they have not played their trump card yet—whatever that may be. There was no question about them expecting the arrival of the militia but the strike leaders did not expect the troops to come quite so soon and in such large numbers.

MORE TROOPS TO THE SCENE.

Vancouver, Aug. 14—One full regiment of the militia of Vancouver, comprising five hundred men, has been summoned to Nanaimo. The call was issued this afternoon and called for the Seventy-second Seaforth. A wire received from Colonel Roe of Victoria, to Lieut. Lackie this afternoon was the first intimation that the local force would be needed. The order was at once issued for the men of the Seaforths to parade at six o'clock in full marching order, with great coats and provisions for twenty-four hours in their haversacks.

The intention is to have them at Nanaimo about daybreak tomorrow.

Besides the infantry, detachments of the engineers of North Vancouver and the field ambulance from this city will go along.

## DIAZ NOT ON

WAY TO MEXICO

Paris, Aug. 14—There is no truth in the report published in the United States that General Porfirio Diaz had left Southampton on July 15th for Japan by way of the Suez Canal, to meet his nephew, Felix Diaz, and accompany him back to Mexico.

The former Mexican president is still in his apartment in Paris.

MR. LIND OFF TO MEXICO.

Washington, Aug. 13—Governor and Mrs. Lind departed for Mexico recently by rail, to proceed via New Orleans and Galveston. Mr. Lind goes to Mexico as President Wilson's personal representative but is not accredited to the Huerta government. The understanding is that when a stable government is established in Mexico, Mr. Lind will be formally named an ambassador.

That Mr. Lind will be empowered to explain to all inquirers the unalterable opposition of the American government to recognition of the Huerta administration, is expected to be a factor which may assist the situation.

Meanwhile, arms and munitions of war from the United States will continue to be denied to the two warring factions and unless it is apparent that the internal efforts to bring about peace have failed, the United States will not offer its services as a mediator. Mr. Lind will undoubtedly act in that capacity when the time comes.

Declarations from both Huerta and Carranza have been made in the press rejecting mediation proposals but administration officials realize that both sides fear they may be showing a weakness in the acceptance of such a proposal at this time and are not convinced that friendly efforts to mediate would prove ineffective. Officials here hope that the effort to put an end to bloodshed and destruction of property would appeal to public opinion in Mexico, and unite the factions on a peace program.

REJECTED LANE WILSON'S PROPOSAL.

Acceptance of the resignation of Ambassador Henry Lane Wilson settled finally that his recommendations for recognition of the Huerta government after a period of military co-operation in Northern Mexico on the part of the United States to restore peace, had been rejected.

The ambassador's views and activities at Mexico City in the closing days of the Taft administration were officially described as at variance with those held by President Wilson and Secretary Bryan and a reiteration came from high officials that the morality of the situation would not permit the recognition of Provisional President Huerta on account of the circumstances surrounding the deaths of Madero and Suarez.
