There is an air of mystery about the strikers' headquarters, and indications are that they have not played their trump card yet-whatever that may There was no question about them expecting the arrival of the militia but the strike leaders did not expect the troops to come quite so soon and in such large numbers.

Vancouver, Aug. 14-One full reginent of the militia of Vancouver, comprising five hundred men, has been summoned to Nanaimo.
