As Result of Conference Yesterday Part of Brief to Railway Commission May be Withdrawn---Conference on Passenger Rates

As a result of a further conference between Board of Trade representatives and representatives of the Freight Department of the C.P.R. yesterday afternoon those sections of the brief of the Board of Trade which has been forwarded to the Railway commission, which have to do with freight rates probably will be withdrawn. This withdrawal will take place after some details have been further arranged but the matters in dispute between railway and merchants are now settled an understanding having been reached yesterday.

Those present yesterday at the conference at the Board of Trade office were H. E. MacDonnell and W. B. Bamford of the C.P.R. Freight Department, C. F. Chestnut J. T. Jennings, J. W. McCready, G. Y. Dibblee F. B. Edgecombe and J. S. Neill of the Board of Trade and Publicity Agent G. M. McDade.

The matters of excessive charges on freight from United States points to Fredericton and from St. John ex ocean steamers were discussed at length. A schedule of charges that were satisfactory were submitted by the C.P.R. representatives. It is understood that this schedule although supposed to be in force has not been.

**FEDERAL VACANCY
IN YORK COUNTY
IN NEAR FUTURE**

Mr. O. S. Crocket Likely to Land a Judgeship---Mr. J. K. Pinder Out For Ottawa Seat---Mr. McLeod's Friends Also Busy

The report that Mr. O. S. Crocket M. P., is to be appointed to a seat on the Supreme Court bench, given currency in The Mail a few days ago, seems to be well founded. Mr. Crocket has been busy pulling wires for some time and while influential members of the bar are opposing his translation to the bench, the politicians as a rule are favorably disposed towards him. They seem to think that he is fairly well equipped for a judicial office, and could easily be spared by the party from the firing line. While the matter is not yet definitely settled it is believed that he will land the prize and that the appointment will be made before long. Followers of the Tory party seem to take it for granted that there will be a vacancy in York in the near future, and are busy discussing the situation. The names most prominently mentioned are those of Hon. H. F. McLeod, Provincial Secretary, and Mr. James K. Pinder, M. P. P. The Provincial Secretary is willing to accept a nomination and is being backed by the machine element of the party. His friends say he would rather stay in the local government provided he secured the appointment of Attorney General in succession to Hon. Mr. Grimmer, who is also slated for the bench. Failing to get this promotion

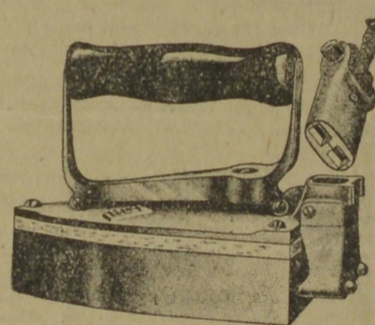

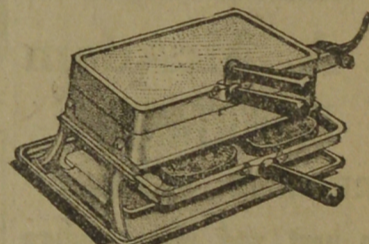
