as well as economical work, and I am glad to bespeak for you to our friends a cordial reception. While you are now employed by the Republican Congressional Committee, now were you employed during the last campaign you did render us very material assistance, and I found you at all times reliable, trustworthy and effective."

MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

On the House side today the Garrett committee heard one witness, Representative George W. Fairchild of New York, and recessed for an indefinite period to take up the study of the Mulhall letters furnished by the Senate Committee, and to consider documents to be presented by the National Association of Manufacturers in answer to a subpoena duces tecum served on James A. Emery, attorney for the Manufacturers Association. The study and arrangement of these documents will occupy the time of the committee for a number of days, Chairman Garrett said, and no witnesses would be examined until it had been completed.

Representative Fairchild was sworn to allow him to make a statement in answer to Col. Mulhall's charge that he is a "large and wealthy manufacturer himself, and one of the most active adherents of the Association" and that he told Mulhall of "meetings and dinners held in Emery's home." Mulhall also declared that he had been sent into Mr. Fairchild's district on three separate occasions at his request. In both 1906 and 1908, Mulhall, said, he worked in Mr. Fairchild's district, and his expenses were paid by the National Association of Manufacturers.

In a formal statement Fairchild denied that he was a member of the Manufacturers Association or an adherent of the Association. He said he had never been approached by any member or representative of the Association relative to any measure pending before the House.
