EXAMINATION OF  
VIOLA REID TO TAKE  
PLACE SATURDAY

Postponement Will be Made Tomorrow  
---Prosecution Claims To Have Complete Evidence Against Accused  
---Many Witnesses

The preliminary examination of Viola Reid of Fredericton Junction, who now is at Burton jail under the charge of causing the death of her infant child, will begin before Magistrate Smith of Fredericton Junction, tomorrow. Mr. P. A. Guthrie of this city, is acting for the defence, and Mr. R. B. Hanson, clerk of the peace for Sunbury, is acting for the prosecution. Mr. Hanson will be unable to attend the examination and adjournment will be made until Saturday when evidence will be heard. Chief of Police George Rideout of Moncton, has worked up the case for the attorney general's department, and is now completing some few links in the evidence. The prosecution will endeavor to prove that the accused gave birth to a child in the Evangelical Rescue Home, which is conducted by the Salvation Army in St. John, that she attempted to give it away without success and that after it was killed its dead body was thrown into a clump of bushes in the Fredericton Junction school yard. It is understood that a considerable number of witnesses will be produced by the prosecution to prove the movements and actions of the accused.

## UNEARTHED U.S.A. BUCKLE

Rev. S. A. Baker, pastor of the Reformed Baptist Church while working in his garden this morning unearthed at a depth of a foot and a half a belt buckle that appeared to be a portion of a United States military uniform. The United States arms appeared plainly on the buckle which is of white metal somewhat tarnished and of heavy construction. Rev. Mr. Baker occupies the old Brown property in King Street West. There is considerable conjecture as to how the buckle came there.

Mrs. Ada Twining as heir of the donor had an interest in the property by which she could prevent its being used for any purpose but that of a public park. The council of last year agreed to buy out her interest the purchase to be made before July 1. The present council is now carrying out that agreement and it is probable that the property will have some expenditure made upon it and will be converted into public recreation ground although under the agreement it can be used for any purpose.
