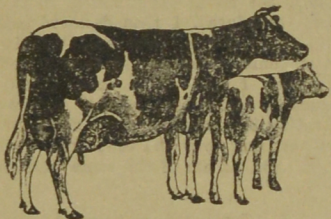

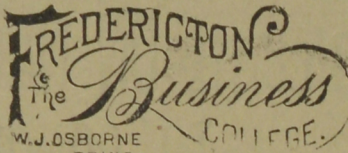

MR. BERNARD SHAW

Paris, Feb. 2.—Bernard Shaw, the
adaptation of whose play "You Never
Can Tell" just produced in Paris,
has been having a hot time at the
hands of the French critics. Abel
Hermant, the distinguished writer
and critic after tracing certain re-
lations between the British humor
and the French humor, expresses the
following opinion: "He is immoderate
he is rough, he is dry. The great
fault with this author which renders
his word sarcasms irritating to the
last degree is that his crudity is dis-
proportionate to the persons and the
objects. Shaw has no sense of pro-
portion whatever, and he thinks
he is a prophet and a precursor, and
that he is shaking society to the
foundations because he has toppled
over a few lies of the social order.
When one sees how even revolutions
change so slightly the face of the
world one can hardly help smiling at
his poor perspective. I would not
like to grieve Shaw by saying things
that will surely be most disagree-
able in his ears, but I am obliged to

McNAB NOW WANTS

\$50,000 DAMAGES

Montreal, Jan. 8.—Mr. Brenton A.
MacNab now seeks \$50,000 from
Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes, Minister
of Militia, for alleged malicious libel.

Previously Mr. MacNab wanted
\$10,000, and a restriction—or failing
the latter, he wanted to have the
minister serve a term in the com-
mon jail.

Now he claims that the alleged
libel has been repeated, and wants
five times the amount previously asked
for.

An amendment has been filed by
Mr. Charles Gaudet, K.C., who is
Mr. MacNab's attorney, in which
prominent Canadians are mentioned.
Mr. Gaudet states "that, inasmuch
as the defendant has denounced the
plaintiff since the institution of his
action in terms of malicious opprobrium
which would have the effect of
placing upon plaintiff odium and dis-
grace, the damages claimed by
plaintiff be increased from \$10,000
to \$50,000."

The plaintiff's attorney specifies
certain places and persons in which
and to whom the defendant is al-
leged to have denounced Mr. Mac-
Nab.

NOTABLE CONFERENCE

OF U. S. EDUCATORS

Philadelphia, Pa., Feb. 7.—The edu-
cational policy of the entire nation
will be discussed at a notable con-
ference of educators to be held in
this city at the end of this month.
The occasion will be the annual con-
vention of the Department of Super-
intendence of the National Education
Association of the United States.
Several thousand members from all
parts of the country will participate
in the program, which will include
addresses by some of the world's
greatest educators.

In conjunction with the convention
of the Department of Superintend-
ence special meetings will be held by
the National Council of Education,
the National Society for the Study
of Education, the Society of College
Teachers of Education, the National
Committee on Agricultural Educa-
tion, the International Kindergarten
Union, the National Association of
School Accounting Officers, the Amer-
ican School Peace League, the Na-
tional Congress of Mothers and
Parent-Teachers' Association and
several other educational bodies of
national scope.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

The City of Fredericton will pre-
sent at the approaching Session of
the Legislative Assembly of New
Brunswick the following bills for en-
actment:

(1) A Bill authorizing the City to
grant certain concessions to the Pal-
mer-McLellan Company, Limited, and
to fix the valuation of the property
of Frasers Limited in this City for
taxation purposes.

(2) A Bill to authorize the issue
of Debentures for the erection of a
Fire Station, a Police Station, for
the purchase of Queen's Park and
for the further construction of Per-
manent Street Pavements, not ex-
ceeding in the whole the sum of
Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000)

(3) A Bill to provide for lighting
by electricity the Fredericton and
St. Mary's Highway Bridge.

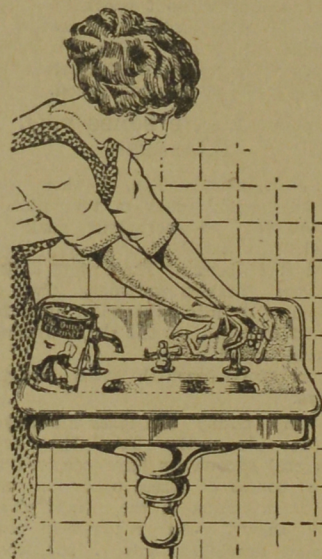
