SUB-CONTRACTOR
ARRESTED FOR
BEATING CREW

Paul Reanta, Who Had Sub-Contract at Dumfries Resented Hibbard Company Taking Over Work
---Before Court Today

Paul Reanta, a Finlander, who had a subcontract from the Hibbard Company Limited, near Dumfries, a short distance below The Barony, on the Fredericton-Woodstock section of the St. John & Quebec Railway, was brought to the city last night in the custody of Deputy Sheriff Timmins and placed in the county jail. This morning he appeared before Police Magistrate Marsh at the magistrate's residence and will be before the police court this afternoon. He is charged with interfering with men employed in the construction of the St. John & Quebec Railway and with threatening them.

The offense with which Reanta is charged is said to have been committed Tuesday night and Wednesday morning. The first reports which came to the city were very much confused and exaggerated. It was then reported to be a Syrian laborer who caused the trouble.

Reanta came to this city Monday and returned to his subcontract on Tuesday. On his arrival he found that the Hibbard Company, dissatisfied with the progress he was making with the work, had sent A. W. Monroe there to take over the contract and that he was there with a crew of men in possession of the camps and material. Reanta lost his temper over this and proceeded to drive everyone out of the camps and off the work. The crew was very much afraid of the man and took to the woods in some cases. On some of them Reanta used physical force. Joseph Purdy of this city, who was keeping books at the camp, was one of those driven out.

Deputy Sheriff Timmins went to Dumfries by C.P.R. and the Southamptton Railway Wednesday night and arrested the man yesterday. He made no resistance. A number of stories about the row are current and by some Reanta is credited with having a revolver and knife in his possession.

Reanta appeared before the police magistrate this afternoon and was remanded until Tuesday.

JOEL S. SCOTT
SENT UP FOR TRIAL
IN SUPREME COURT

Seriousness of Offence Reason for Sending Case to High Court---
Application for Bail Expected to be Made

Joel S. Scott this morning was sent up for trial at the York Sittings of the Supreme Court which will open here Tuesday, June 24. The judge assigned to the York Sittings is Judge White. Police Magistrate Marsh sent Scott up for trial by the Supreme Court on account of the seriousness of the charge preferred against him, that of having carnal knowledge of a girl under fourteen years of age.

The Attorney General's department, it is understood, was desirous that this case go to the York Sittings the charge being one of the most serious on the calendar. The penalty is life-imprisonment with flogging.

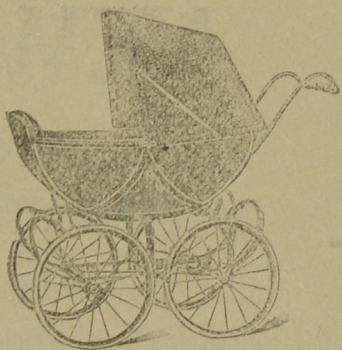

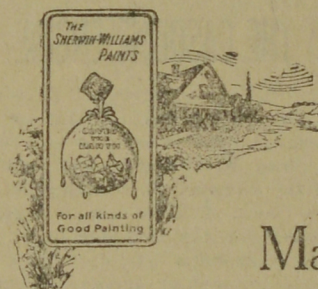
