New York, June 14—Impressive memorial services are to be held tomorrow in observance of the ninth anniversary of the burning of the steamer General Slocum in the East River here, which occurred June 15, 1904, with the loss of more than 1,000 lives. The principal services will be held in the Lutheran cemetery in Queens, borough, where many of the victims were buried and where a handsome monument has been erected in memory of the unidentified dead.

PECULIAR POISONING CASE.

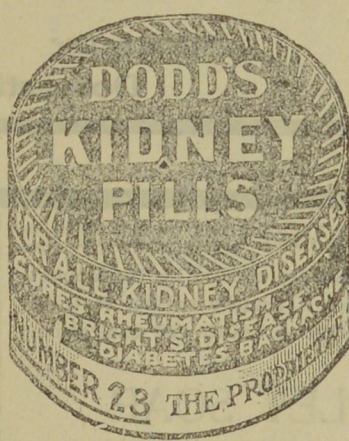

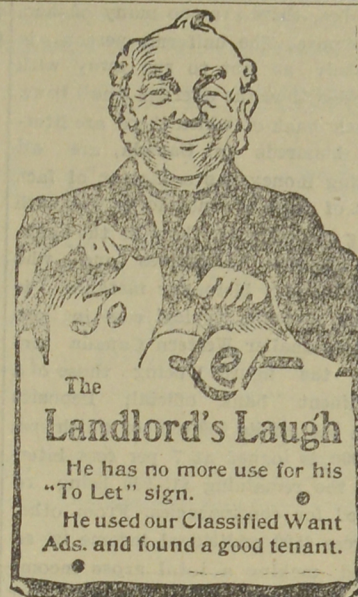
