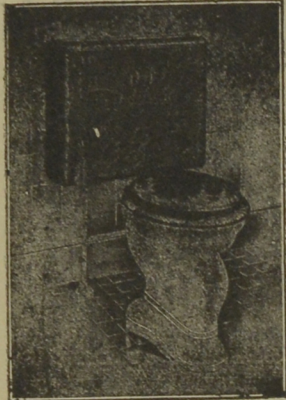

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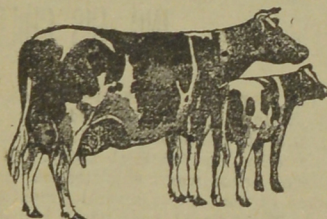

**THE LABOR ACT IN NORTHUMBERLAND CO.**

To the Editor of The Mail:

Dear Sir—In reply to a letter signed Mr. Hammon and published in last week's Mail, with your permission I wish to say that with regard to Mr. Hammon's first question as to why I did not publish my reply to "Ratepayer," in The Mail, I may say that as "Ratepayer" condemned the government for what he claimed to be a lax enforcement of the provisions of the Labor Act, I felt that in the interests of truth and justice, his statements ought to be contradicted; my reply must therefore necessarily uphold the government to the extent of their administration of the Labor Act at least and as the editor of The Mail is opposed to the present administration I do not think he would wish to publish a letter upholding it in any way and I did not wish to place that gentleman in a position where he would probably feel it necessary to refuse a reasonable request.

With reference to Mr. Hammon's second question, as to why "Ratepayer" did not reply to my letter in The Advocate, I may say that he himself can best answer that question as Mr. Hammon and "Ratepayer" are synonymous terms.

With regard to my alleged fake statement in saying that "Ratepayer" intimated that under the former government a man could get his firewood, whereas now he has to pay for it, I think he is in error. As "Ratepayer's" state ments are not very clear and his real meaning, so to speak, more or less involved in doubt, it would not be an unpardonable offence to misconstrue or mistake his language. However "Ratepayer" does state that this devastation of the forest of which he complains did not exist under the old government. This destruction of the forest, he further states, is caused by reason of its being parcelled out to applicants under the Labor Act so that "now," he says, "if some man wants a few cords of wood he is very often compelled to buy it," etc. What does this mean if it does not signify that "now" as distinguished from the time of the old regime, he must buy? Moreover, it is well known that (not to be too personal) certain parties did for years cut their firewood in trespass on the crown and it is equally well known that now, because the site of their former trespass has been taken up under the Labor Act, they must buy their wood. Is this where the shoe pinches?

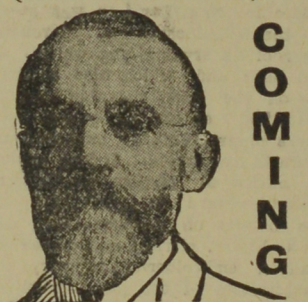
**BOURASSA ON THE CODERRE CASE**

(Toronto Globe)

Mr. Henri Bourassa in Le Devoir talks very plainly about the Coderre case. He declares that the facts so far as they have been disclosed lead to but one conclusion: either the authors of the accusations are not the villains that Mr. Doherty, Minister of Justice denounced with indignant virtue, but are themselves victims of the spell the politicians have exercised on them to make them contradict their accusations, and so their denunciation subsists, or they are in effect vile criminals who should have been arrested weeks ago. "In either case," says Mr. Bourassa "Mr. Coderre should understand that his place is not in the Ministry. If he proves more deaf to the counsels of decency than to the solicitations of 'Dear Emile' and to the demands of 'friend' Lalumiere, the Prime Minister, guardian of the honor of the Cabinet, is under obligation to recall the Secretary of State to an understanding of the proprieties." It would seem from this vigorous demand for Mr. Coderre's resignation that the Nationalist leader does not regard the defence made on behalf of Mr. Coderre as satisfactory. If "Dear Emile" Mr. Coderre's cousin tried to blackmail him by means of a perjured affidavit, clearly Emile ought to be in jail. And until he is put in jail Mr. Coderre ought not to be in the Cabinet.

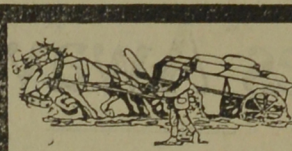

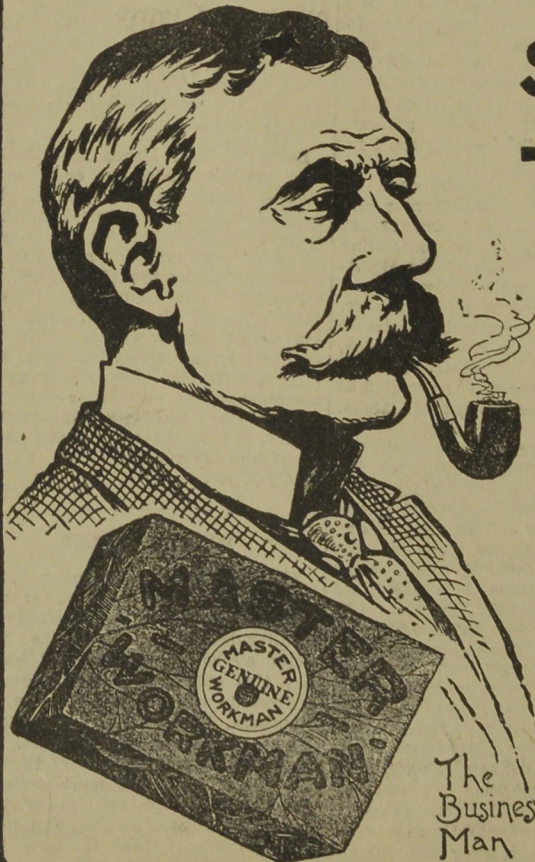
