

Such was the declaration of Mr. Carvell, who spoke ninety minutes before the House adjourned on Sat-urday last. He had already spoken during the afternoon and evening for a total of three hours. With fresh energy ne en'ered the breach again at 11.40 p. m., talking right up to the First I ord of the Admiralty in his assortion of Canada's inability to build ships and do things in this country in a lig way. Referring to Mr. Winston Churchill he said: "The man doesn't know we've got a steel plant in this country. We've got a treat plant that reduces his astimate steel plant that reduces his estimate of the first cost, \$30,000,000 at one swoop. We always admitted it would be inadvisable to build the guns in Canada. That takes off another three or four millions.


CHURCHILL DON'T KNOW


