ENFORCING THE LAW IN BORDER TOWNS

Calais, May 21.—When Marshall Gibson assumed his duties as head of the St. Stephen police department, there was much speculation as to what his attitude would be towards the liquor dealers but all doubts were set at rest on Monday when the marshal got busy, much to the disgust of the wine merchants, who were hopeful of an easy time for an indefinite period. Marshal Gibson did not follow the example of his predecessors in striking at the little fellows in the prohibited business, but raided the Windsor Hotel, one of the leading houses across the line, where he secured a quantity of liquor. He then started for other shops where the contraband is sold, but word of his coming had been flashed along the line and he found all doors closed against him. Marshal Gibson says if St. Stephen wants a strict enforcement of the liquor laws he will give it.

Special Officer Hanev of the Treasury department, has been making things uncomfortable for a number of persons along the American side of the border, who are more or less in favor of free trade, and, as a result of his activity during the week, several residents will likely get a trip to Portland to answer to charges of smuggling. Four horses alleged to have been brought in duty free, have been seized, and at Woodland a quantity of soap of Canadian manufacture have been added to the spoils.

PRINCIPALS IN BATTLE REPORTED FROM OTTAWA

(Montreal Herald.)

The reported dispute between Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes, minister of militia, and General Colin Mackenzie chief of general staff at headquarters, brings into conflict two men who love an encounter, one warm Irish and the other hot Scotch. If all accounts are true, fiery passages were exchanged between them in correspondence.

General Mackenzie was loaned to Canada by the War Office at home, and has the title: "Chief, Canadian Section, Imperial General Staff." (Vide "Who's Who.")

Possibly Col. Hughes regards him as chief of the Canadian General Staff, as his salary is paid by Canada. But, anyway, generals have no terrors for Sam Hughes. He has himself the blood of great soldiers in his veins. His great grandfather was General Sainte Pierre, who was Brigadier of Cuirassiers under Napoleon and together with his two sons was shot and killed in the Battle of Waterloo. For the Colonel is not only of Irish but Huguenot descent. He told Parliament Champlain must have been a good man because his name was Samuel.

No, indeed, he's not scared of a General, for he fought General Hutton to a finish at the time of the South African war and after.

WANTED TO GO TO WAR.

Col. Hughes then, as now, a member of the Canadian parliament, offered to raise a Canadian regiment for the war. General Hutton, G.O.C., (General Commanding Officer) told him, in effect, to go way back and sit down. But Col. Hughes is not always amenable to discipline, and not at all of retiring disposition. He made his own way to South Africa and was mentioned in despatches as rendering effective aid in the war.

Believing, in his callow youth, that the pen is mightier than the sword, Mr. Hughes became an editor, but early associated himself with the local battalion which he afterwards commanded. He was prominent as an athlete and renowned as a fighter. He once decorated his newspaper with a picturesque account of how he licked his man with one hand. Hit fighting and martial spirit carried him into active service and he held important appointments on the field in the Transvaal War. His son is a soldier.

In all his fighting, politically and otherwise, Col. Hughes' quick temper is always redeemed by his Irish humor, and balanced by a strong sense of fair play.

A DISTINGUISHED OFFICER.

General Mackenzie belongs to the famous Scaforth Highlanders. His father was a brigadier-general. He was A.D.C. to Lord Roberts in India director of military intelligence in South Africa, commanded the 6th Brigade at Aldershot and has seen active service in several foreign campaigns, including Egypt, and holds many clasps. He was created a Companion of the Order of the Bath in recognition of his eminent services.

It is rumored that in South Africa General Mackenzie encountered the valiant Col. Hughes. It is possible, as reported from Ottawa, that there was friction there between them, as General Mackenzie was Director of Military Intelligence, and Col. Hughes was on the Intelligence staffs of both General Suttle and General Sir Charles Warren.

Details of the reported tiff may enliven the tail end of parliament and relieve the staleness of committee of supply on rations and camp contracts.

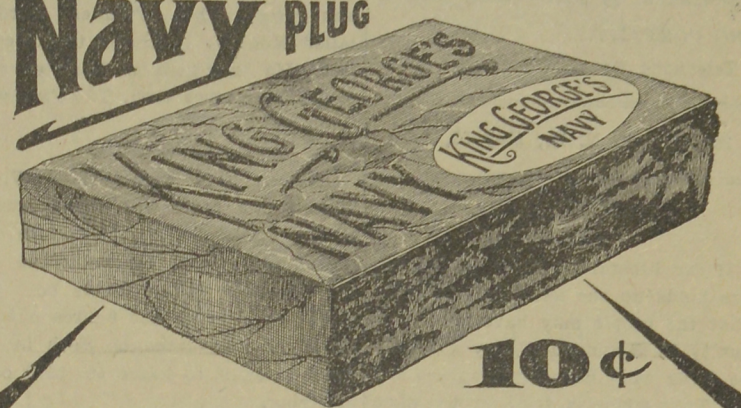

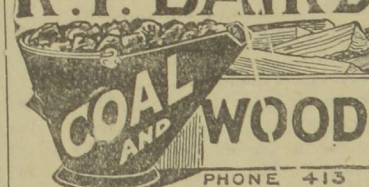

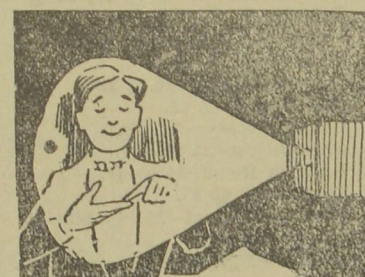
