STREAMDRIVERS  
READY FOR SLIGHTEST  
RISE OF WATER

Rain Was General all Over the Province  
Last Night and Today--Expected  
That Drives Will be Materially  
Helped

The rain which was heavy here last night was general all over the province and lumber operators who have had logs held up expect that the rise of water which is sure to follow will do much for the drives, especially those on streams in the central part of the province. The streams are being watched closely and crews of streamdrivers are in readiness to be put on work as soon as the lumber shows any sign of moving.

Telegraph messages from the Upper St. John River are to the effect that the rain there was heavy last night and today. The same weather conditions prevailed in Eastern Quebec and Northern Maine and in fact all over the basin of the St. John River. It will be two or three days before the effect of the rainfall on the headwaters is felt here the river being low and current sluggish at the present time.

The rains of a few days ago caused a rise of about eight inches here this week but the rise was checked before the present rain began. It is expected however that the effect of these rains will be noticed here soon.

## ON THE MIRAMICHI

Conditions on the Miramichi have been similar to those on the St. John.
