

DARING BANK ROBBERY
AT MIDNIGHT IN EDMONTON

Edmonton, Alta., Jan. 30.—The most daring bank robbery in the history of this city was pulled off at half-past twelve this morning in the most thickly populated part of the city. Two unknown masked men, carrying a coil of rope, entered the Bank of Nova Scotia and at the point of a gun demanded of the only person in the building, a ledger-keeper named Clare West, that he throw up his hands. West refused to comply and a desperate struggle ensued, while many late pedestrians passed by totally unaware of what was going on inside the bank. Eventually the robbers managed to bind West, and hurriedly proceeded to open the safe which they rifled of a hundred dollars. While they were continuing the search, West managed to secure his revolver, which was lying nearby and fired four shots at the men. They returned the fire, hitting him in the forearm. Then they made their escape through the rear, while those on the outside who heard the shots were unable to get in the front door, which the robbers had locked after them. The police were soon on the spot and made a hurried search, but no trace could be found of the men. West was considerably weakened by the loss of blood but is now resting easy at the hospital. No trace has yet been secured of the robbers.


MR. MACNAB'S SUIT
AGAINST COL. HUGHES

Montreal, Jan. 30.—Wherefore the plaintiff prays that the defendant be condemned in the sum of \$10,000 damages for the reasons set forth, and while considering the monetary damages of secondary importance, further prays for an unconditional written retraction, failing which, that the defendant be condemned to a course of imprisonment in the common jail of Montreal, conformable to law.

This statement concludes the inscription of the writ in the action brought by Mr. B. A. Macnab, late editor of The Montreal Star, against Colonel the Hon. Sam Hughes, minister of militia, for \$10,000 damages for alleged slander, which was returnable today in the Superior Court. Elsewhere in the writ the plaintiff alleged that the minister of militia, in July, 1912, informed a well-known man in journalism in Montreal that he (the plaintiff), with the late Lieut. Colonel Worthington of Sherbrooke, were interested in a small-arms company of England, and that for a monetary consideration and otherwise had conspired to campaign against the Ross rifle. That, further, while Mr. Macnab was in England, "on a matter of national importance," last July, that Colonel Hughes had stated he could ruin him, and that he had documentary evidence which he could use to that effect.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

The City of Fredericton will present at the approaching Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick the following bills for enactment:

(1) A Bill authorizing the City to grant certain concessions to the Palmer-McLellan Company, Limited, and to fix the valuation of the property of Frasers Limited in this City for taxation purposes.

(2) A Bill to authorize the issue of Debentures for the erection of a Fire Station, a Police Station, for the purchase of Queen's Park and for the further construction of Permanent Street Pavements, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000).

(3) A Bill to provide for lighting by electricity the Fredericton and St. Mary's Highway Bridge.
